## Another Postseason Bid Capped 2004-05 Season

Nagging injuries plagued the 2004-05 University of Florida women's basketball team, but through grit and determination, the Gators found a way to earn a postseason bid for the second consecutive year and for the 12th time in the last 13 seasons.

Florida was one of 32 teams selected to compete in the postseason Sportsview.tv WNIT, where the team fell just short of advancing to the round of 16.

scorer with 13.6 points per game. She also contributed 5.4 rebounds, the second most, while playing a team-high 29.4 minutes per outing.

Senior **Tamia Williams** netted 10.7 points during the final stretch, while shooting 38.1 percent (16-42) from the three-point arc.

**Dalila Eshe** crashed the boards even harder, collecting 6.9 during those final seven games, while hitting 80 percent (12-15) from the free throw line.

**Brittany Davis** also was big down the stretch, contributing 7.4 points with 4.9 rebounds and shooting 61.3 percent (19-31) from the field.

### Bumps & Bruises

**Danielle Santos** played in each of the last 10 games, returning to the court after a 10-game absence due to a stress fracture in her right foot that she suffered on Dec. 19 during the game at Baylor.

**Tashia Morehead** nursed a pair of injuries throughout the season. She sprained her left ankle with 12:12 remaining in the Dec. 8 game against Stetson. Morehead already was rehabbing a strained right quad she injured during practice on Nov. 17 and missed three straight practices as a result.

**Kim Dye** suffered a season-ending injury to her left knee during the team's shoot-around prior to the Jan. 9 game against Auburn. An MRI revealed a torn anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) and a partially torn medial collateral ligament.

### Good Losses...?

Eleven of UF's 15 losses were against teams ranked (LSU twice, Baylor, Georgia twice, Vanderbilt twice, Tennessee) or receiving votes (Florida State & Iowa) in the final USA Today/ESPN Coaches' poll. Richmond, Ole Miss and Alabama (twice) are the only teams UF has lost to that did not receive votes in the final poll.

### Tough Final Stretch

The Gator's final three games of the regular season were against teams currently ranked in the top-25.

### UF vs. Ranked Teams this season

The Gators were 0-8 this season versus nationally ranked teams, falling to Baylor, to LSU (twice), to Georgia (twice), to Vanderbilt (twice) and to Tennessee.

### UF vs. Ranked Teams on the Road

Since the 1990-91 season, UF is 14-43 on the road (not including neutral site courts) versus nationally ranked teams. The Gator's most recent road win against a ranked team was on Feb. 29, 2004 when UF topped No. 18 Auburn 71-60 in Auburn, Ala, in the Gator's regular season finale.

## Did you Know?

\*The Gators set a program record in 2004-05 with **169 three-pointers**, needing just 26 games to break the previous mark of 157 set during the 2000-01 season in 30 games.

\*UF's free throw percentage of 72.5% broke the previous program record of 70.1% set during the 2000-01 season.

\*The 11 three-pointers UF made against Temple on Dec. 4 tied the program record.

\***Tashia Morehead** hit at least one three-point in 15 consecutive games, the fourth longest streak in UF history.

\*Florida was one of only two schools in the country that played at least one regular season game against three of the 2005 FINAL FOUR participants (Mississippi State was the other).

### UF vs. Ranked Teams

Since the 1990-91 season, UF is 43-89 against nationally ranked opponents (using the Associated Press poll only), including a 5-23 record under Carolyn Peck (0-8 this year).

### Just Finish

During UF's five-game SEC losing streak, the Gators actually held a second half lead in four of those games. The only game UF did not hold a late lead was during the Feb. 6 outing at Alabama.

### 500th Program Win

The Gators 70-59 victory over Kentucky on February 10 was the 500th win in the 31-year history of the program. UF's record at the time of the milestone win was 500-379.

### That Smarts!

Junior **Sarah Lowe** became just the second UF women's basketball player ever to be recognized regionally for her academic achievements, when she was named to the 2005 ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District III Second Team. Lowe carries an impressive 3.86 grade point average while working toward majors in Spanish and Political Science. Fellow junior **Danielle Santos** was honored last year as a second team selection.

### Senior Salute

**Tishona Gregory** is on pace to earn her bachelor's degree in Sociology in May.

**Tashia Morehead** is scheduled to graduate next spring with a degree in Exercise & Sport Science/Education.

**Tamia Williams** will graduate in May with a degree in Family, Youth & Community Sciences.

### Welcome Back Danielle!

Junior **Danielle Santos** played 12 minutes in the Jan. 30 game at Vanderbilt, marking her first action since suffering a stress fracture in her right foot during the Dec. 19 game at Baylor. Santos, who is regarded as UF's top defender and missed 10 games with the injury, had been UF's second-leading scorer with 9.9 points per game when she left the lineup, as well as ranked second for assists (2.8 pg) and steals (1.8 pg) and being the team's top three-point threat (40.0 percent, 16-40)

### Sharing the Wealth

Six different Gators led UF in scoring (Bernice Mosby, Danielle Santos, Tamia Williams, Brittany Davis, Sarah Lowe and Tashia Morehead), while nine of the 11 on the roster scored double-figures at least once.

### She Can Do It

According to the UT SID staff, **Carolyn Peck** had been the only former Lady Vol assistant coach or player who collected a victory against Tennessee - until UT's NCAA Semifinal loss to Michigan State which featured former assistant AI Brown and former player Semeeka Randall on the staff. During Purdue's national championship season with Peck at the helm, the Boilermakers ended UT's 46-game winning streak with a 78-68 decision on Nov. 15, 1998.

### Team Captains

At the conclusion of the team's shoot-around prior to the Nov. 4 exhibition game, head coach Carolyn Peck announced that the senior trio of **Tishona Gregory**, **Tashia Morehead** and **Tamia Williams** will be the tri-captains of the 2004-05 squad.

### Travel Woes Continued!

UF's SEC opening victory at Arkansas on January 6 was just the team's third road trip of the season... and it's second with serious travel complications on the return trip to Gainesville!

After defeating the Razorbacks Thursday evening, the team boarded its Delta charter 60 minutes behind schedule. Then as the plane approached Gainesville, the pilot was told that too much fog had settled into the area and could not land and was rerouted to Jacksonville, touching down at 2:20 a.m. Since the airport already had closed, the team had to stay on the aircraft until 3:40 a.m. and wait in the luggage area for their bags AND a bus that was traveling FROM Gainesville to pick them up. The bus finally arrived at the JAX airport at 4:45 a.m. and delivered the squad back to the Gainesville airport at 6:35 a.m. Friday. It wasn't quite how junior **Brittany Davis** planned on spending the first hours of her 21st birthday.

### Mosby Joins 1,000-Point Club

Junior **Bernice Mosby** became the 18th different Gator to score 1,000 career points when she nailed an eight-foot jumper giving her 10 points with 5:28 remaining in the first half of the Jan. 27 game at Georgia. Mosby tied as the eighth fastest Gator to reach the scoring milestone, as the game against Georgia was her 77th wearing the Orange and Blue.

### 250 at Home

UF's 66-59 win over Boston on December 29th was the 250th home victory in program history. The Gators held a 250-110 home record in 31 years of varsity competition after the milestone win.

### Busy, Busy

Florida played three games over a five-day span three times this season. The State Farm Classic marked the beginning of the last of those busy runs, as the Gators concluded their final three-game stretch on Jan. 2 playing host to South Florida.

### Sunshine State Foes

The Gators are 194-54 all-time (3-2 this season) against their in-state rivals, including a 11-3 record under Coach Peck.

### Whew!

The Gator's Dec. 12 outing versus Oregon State was UF's seventh game in the previous 17 days!

### Home Sweet Home

The Gators have only two non-SEC road trips this season ... and returning from the first trip was an adventure! After playing Nov. 26 and 27 in the Bahamas, the team departed for the airport on Nov. 28 at 3 p.m. The flight leaving the Bahamas for Ft. Lauderdale was delayed until approximately 10 p.m., when the team took the short 25 minute flight to the continental U.S.

Upon arrival in Ft. Lauderdale, 15 luggage bags were missing and it took the team almost two hours to sort out the missing bags with Bahamasair. Then the starving Gators searched for food in Ft. Lauderdale and finally found grub and were back on the bus at 1:15 a.m. ready to return to Gainesville... pulling into the parking lot at 5:45 a.m.!

### Together Again

Sophomore **Briana Phillips** and freshman **Depree Bowden** were teammates at Southeast High School in Bradenton. They were just the second pair of former teammates and the first set of prep teammates on UF's roster since the 1995-96 season, when the sister duo of **Charmaine & DeLisha Milton** suited up for the Gators after playing together at the Bradwell Institute (Ga.).

These are the only two sets of high school teammates ever to play for the Gators. (NOTE: high schools for all members of the 1978-79 team and prior could not be confirmed)

### Preseason Schedule Rated Fifth Toughest

The Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) released its 2004-05 rankings of all NCAA Division I schedules and the University of Florida's 27-game slate is rated as the fifth toughest in the country.

While the majority of the teams on UF's 2004-05 schedule remain the same as last year's slate that ranked as the third toughest in the country, the one noticeable difference is the quantity of home games. The Gators were road warriors in 2003-04, playing nine of their first 10 away from the O'Connell Center. The reverse applies this season, when the team plays host to a program-record 17 regular season games.

Southeastern Conference foe Tennessee plays the toughest schedule in the country, according to the WBCA/Summerville RPI listing, followed by Virginia, Duke and Kansas.

### Gators Sign SIX for 2005-06

**LaToya Bullard** (5-7, PG, Memphis, Tenn.), **Brooke Cornish** (6-4, F, Collegeville, Pa.), **Marshae Dotson** (6-0, F, Columbus, Ohio) and **Jessica Jackson** (6-4, C, Collierville, Tenn.) signed National Letters of Intent during the early signing period to attend UF and comprise the Gators' 2005-06 freshmen class.

Two more prep stars joined the quartet during the late signing period, when **Sha Brooks** (5-9, G, Jackson, Tenn.) and **Kim Critton** (5-8, G/F, Memphis, Tenn.) announced their intention to become Gators.

Before Brooks' and Critton's official signings during the late period to attend the University of Florida, the Gator's 2004-05 recruiting class was ranked No. 7 by Mike Flynn's Blue Star Report, the second highest ranking of any other class in program history. The 1993-94 freshmen class was ranked as the fifth best in the country, according to Women's Basketball News Service out of New York. Kodak All-American and current WNBA star Murriel Page highlighted that class, which also included Mahogany Hudson, Danelle Liles, Dana Smith and Nicole Sullivan.
