Exhibition Game 1: Florida 90, EA Sports 73

Nov. 8, 2005 * Gainesville, FL * Stephen C. O'Connell Center

A pair of Gators reached double digits in scoring to lead head coach **Carolyn Peck's** squad to a 90-73 victory over EA Sports in the exhibition opener on Tuesday night at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

Senior **Brittany Davis** enjoyed one of her best nights as a Gator as she led the Orange and Blue with 33 points and 10 rebounds. Classmate **Dalila Eshe** had a double-double in the first half alone with 17 points and 10 rebounds and went on to finish the night with what would be career-highs with 23 points and 13 boards.

"I was pleased with what I saw from our team tonight," UF head coach **Carolyn Peck** said. "You can get frustrated real easily when you are going up against each other in practice everyday because you know what the other person is doing. I thought, for our first time out, we did a good job of extending our game up and down the floor."

The Gators opened the game on a 10-0 run, powered by four points from **Depree Bowden**, and UF never looked back en route to a 47-35 lead at the intermission. UF was 54 percent from the field on 19-for-35 shooting during the first 20 minutes of play. EA Sports mounted a 9-1 run to cut the deficit to as few as five points at 23-18, but the Gators responded with a 12-5 spurt to push their lead back to double-digits.

Florida finished the contest with 22 assists to just 11 turnovers while forcing 18 possession changes. The Gators outscored EA Sports 44-32 in the paint and had a 20-10 advantage in points off turnovers.

"We know that for us to accomplish our goals, defense has got to be our main focus," Peck added. "Our guards did a good job of getting the basketball to our post players. When I see that we had 22 assists, I know that we played very good team basketball tonight. This is a nice way to start our exhibition season."

Former Florida graduate **Tamia Williams** led the visitors with 17 points. Courtney McDaniel, a 2004 graduate of Tennessee, posted a double-double with 15 points and 10 rebounds.

"I miss it a lot, and it was great getting to play in the O' Dome again," Williams said following the contest. "I can tell that the team is getting used to the system and that they have good chemistry. It was a lot of fun being able to come in here and play again."

Exhibition Game 2: Florida 96, Miami Suns 63

Florida closed its second and final exhibition game on a 16-1 run while forcing 24 turnovers in a 96-63 victory over the Miami Suns Monday night at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

UF senior **Brittany Davis** was one of three Gators to reach double-digits prior to halftime with 13, while **Sha Brooks** totaled 11 and **Danielle Santos** added 10 en route to a 42-31 Florida advantage at the break.

The UF trio finished with 25, 21 and 12 points respectively to lead the Gators in scoring on the night. Sophomore **Depree Bowden** added 10 points in the contest to round out the Gators in double-figures.

"We always like to win," UF head coach **Carolyn Peck** said. "We set three main goals this season that we are looking to accomplish every game. They are to win the war on the boards, score more points than the other team and stay under 13 turnovers. We went three turnovers over our goal of 13, but we won the other two."

A stifling Florida defense forced 16 turnovers in the game's first 20 minutes and scored 17 of its first 42 points off those possession changes. The traveling squad from South Beach made their last field goal of the evening at the 5:16 mark on a three-pointer from Yolanda McCormick.

The Suns were able to stay within striking distance for a majority of the first half thanks to six

Game 1: Florida 83, St. Francis (NY) 57

Nov. 18, 2005 * South Orange, NJ * Walsh Gym * Seton Hall Classic

Freshman **Sha Brooks** led an extremely balanced scoring attack helping the University of Florida women's basketball team to an 83-57 victory over St. Francis (NY) College in the first round of the Seton Hall Basketball Classic. The win, which was the Gators' 11th season-opening victory in the last 12 years, provided head coach **Carolyn Peck** her 100th career coaching win, as she improved her six-year record to 100-56.

Eight of nine Gators scored in the victory, with Brooks leading the way with 14 points along with four steals, while **Dalila Eshe** (Tallahassee), **Depree Bowden** (Palmetto) and **Danielle Santos** (Marietta, Ga.) netting 13 apiece. **Brittany Davis** (Gainesville) tallied nine points with five rebounds, while freshman **Marshae Dotson** (Columbus, Ohio) scored eight points on 4-of-4 shooting with seven rebounds. Rounding out the scoring was **Kim Critton** (Memphis, Tenn.), who tallied seven and **Jessica Jackson** (Collierville, Tenn.) who netted six.

Tiffany Hill scored a game-high 26 points for St. Francis, which committed 26 turnovers. Justine Paxhia was the only other Terrier in double-figures, netting 17.

The teams exchanged buckets twice to begin the second half before Florida ripped off a 12-0 run to take a commanding 61-36 lead with 13:25 remaining. The Gators also turned up its defense holding the Terriers to 33.3 percent shooting for the half, 40.7 percent for the game. UF out-rebounded SFC by 10 in the final 20 minutes, emerging with a 39-30 edge on the boards for the game.

UF shot a steady 50.8 percent from the floor during the game, including a 55.2 clip in the opening stanza.

The game was tied at 29 with just over five minutes remaining in the first half before the Gators closed the period on a 13-2 run, using a smothering full court press that harassed the Terriers to commit several turnovers. Six different Gators scored during the run that helped UF build a 44-31 halftime lead.

Florida's defense forced 16 turnovers during that opening frame, with the Gators collecting just five steals. St. Francis held the slight 14-13 rebounding edge and shot 48.1 percent (13-27) from the floor. UF shot an impressive 55.2 percent (16-29) from the field and receiving balanced scoring from eight of the nine players who saw action, with **Dalila Eshe**, **Sha Brooks** and **Danielle Santos** each recording eight points and **Brittany Davis** adding seven.

Game 2: Florida 52, Seton Hall 48

Nov. 19, 2005 * South Orange, NJ * Walsh Gym * Seton Hall Classic

Brittany Davis powered up a layin with 26 seconds remaining to give the Florida a two-point lead en route to a 52-48 victory over Seton Hall (0-1) in the second round of the Seton Hall Basketball Classic. Fellow Gator senior **Daila Eshe** capped the scoring with another layin at the buzzer to end the game's scoring.

The Gators (2-0) shot just 33.9 percent (21-62), but forced 23 turnovers and held a 37-34 rebounding advantage.

Sha Brooks led a balanced Gator scoring attack for the second consecutive night, recording 18 points with seven steals in 40 minutes of work. **Danielle Santos** added 12 points with four rebounds and three steals, while Davis added 10 points. Eshe collected a team-high eight rebounds with seven points in the win.

Heta Korpivaara was the lone Pirate in double figures, netting 11, while Monique Blake collected a game-high 11 rebounds with nine points.

Florida shot just 3-of-14 to start the second half, but never relinquished the lead during the stretch, as the Pirates also struggled during the opening minutes by hitting 2-of-8. With Florida holding a 40-34 lead, Monique Blake converted a three-point play and the Gators committed four turnovers while missing their shots, as Seton Hall staged a 7-0 run to take a 41-40 lead with just under eight minutes remaining. **Danielle Santos** hit a baseline runner to stop the spree as the Gators re-took the lead, but Blake answered with a shot that rattled around and fell in as the shot clock expired.

Brooks coolly nailed a three-point from the baseline with 4:53 on the clock to give the Gators a 45-43 lead. She then came up with a pair of steals on consecutive defensive possessions, but UF couldn't convert on either. SHU's Heta Korpivaara then hit a nifty runner in the lane to tie the game with 3:48 remaining. Brooks missed two free throws the next time down which hurt as Korpivaara canned a three-pointer that gave the hosts a 48-45 lead with just over three minutes remaining.

Brooks then collected a loose ball after a Santos' block, running the floor through traffic and dropping in a layup with 1:57 on the clock to bring the Gators within one, 48-47. Santos then snatched the defensive board and was fouled by Blake. Santos hit the front end of the 1-and-1, missed the back end, but collected the offensive board. But UF couldn't capitalize as **Davis** was called for a three-second lane violation and Seton Hall took possession.

Korpivaara missed a three-point attempt and Blake collected the rebound, but fell out of bounds giving the ball back to the Gators. This time, Florida's seniors came through, as Santos dished the ball inside to Davis, who powered up a layup with 26 seconds remaining to give the Gators a 50-48 lead. Kari Shutz then missed her trey attempt with 13 seconds left and **Depree Bowden** collected the miss and fired it out to a streaking **Eshe**, who dribbled half the court and sank a layup as the final horn sounded.

The teams traded mini runs for the first 13 minutes of the game when SHU's Britney Messina canned a three-pointer with 6:40 on the clock to give the Pirates their second 4-point lead of the game. However, the Gators responded with a 12-2 run to take a 29-22 advantage after **Danielle Santos'** capped the spree with a trey. **Marshae Dotson** came off the bench to spark the run, scoring three points with three rebounds and an assist. Seton Hall got its offensive back on track with a bucket and four free throws to get within one, 29-28. The teams then traded buckets to end the half with the Gators holding a slim 31-30 advantage.

Florida also held a 22-15 cushion on the boards in the first half, grabbing 10 offensive rebounds while holding the Pirates to just three. The Gators also shot the ball 13 more times, but converted just 35.1 percent (13-37) of their shots compared to SHU's 41.7 percent (10-24) mark.

Game 3: Florida State 82, Florida 76 Nov. 23, 2005 • Tallahassee, FL • Tucker Civic Center

Tallahassee native **Dalila Eshe** scored a career-high 21 points with seven rebounds in front of her hometown family and friends, but it wasn't enough as the Gators (2-1) lost to Florida State 82-76 at the Tucker Civic Center in front of 1,711.

Florida held an 11-point lead, 57-46, with just over 11 minutes remaining before the Seminoles (2-1) charged back with an 11-2 run and followed with shortly thereafter with a devastating 12-2 march to take a 75-67 lead with under two minutes remaining.

The teams shot identically from the floor, hitting 29-of-59 for the game with each canning one three-pointer. But the scoring difference came at the free throw line, where the Gators made 13-of-19 and Seminoles hit 19-of-28. The other major difference was rebounding, where FSU outrebounded UF 23-11 in the second half (35-31 for the game), with 11 of the Seminoles second-half boards offensive. FSU also did not commit a turnover in the final 10 minutes of the game.

Included among Eshe's career scoring effort were the first two three-pointers of her career. Joining Eshe in the double-figure scoring column was **Sha Brooks**, **Brittany Davis** and **Marsha Dotson**, who contributed 14, 13 and 10 points, respectively. Dotson also collected seven rebounds and shot 4-of-5 from the field in 19 minutes of action.

Trailing 38-31 in the early stages of the second half, Florida chipped away at the deficit and got to within one point three different times before **Dalila Eshe** hit a jumper with 15:42 to put the Gators over the hump and take a 45-44 lead. That bucket sparked a 16-2 spree, as Florida extended its lead to 11 points, 57-46, with 11:01 remaining. Freshmen **Sha Brooks** had eight points and **Marsha Dotson** tallied four points with several rebounds during the stretch.

After the teams traded buckets, it was Florida State's turn to make a run, staging an 11-2 march to tie the game at 61 with 6:08 remaining. UF didn't relinquish the lead for the next few minutes and the game was tied twice more. With the Gators holding a 65-63 lead, FSU ripped off a 12-2 run, getting six of those points off of multiple offensive rebound chances, to take a 75-67 lead with under two minutes remaining.

Santos converted a three-point play with 55 seconds left to close the gap to five, 75-70. Eshe then stole the ball off the inbounds pass, making one free throw after being fouled to get UF within four. Ganiyat Adeduntan responded for FSU, coolly converting four straight free throws to lift the Seminoles back to an eight point lead, 79-71, with 31 seconds remaining. **Brooks** canned a trey with 23 ticks left to give UF hope, down just five, but Adeduntan hit another attempt from the stripe to give FSU an 80-74 lead. Dotson sank two from the charity line afterwards to get the Gators within four, but Tanae Davis-Cain followed with two from the line to end the game's scoring.

Both teams raced up and down the floor trading shots that resulted in four lead changes and one tie in the initial two and half minutes of the game. UF finally hit two consecutive field goals and held a 10-6 lead. The teams again traded buckets before FSU used a 7-0 run to take a 15-12 lead with 11:47 on the clock.

Sarah Lowe stopped the spree by sinking two free throws and a driving layin. With UF holding an 18-17 lead after a nifty drive to the basket by **Sha Brooks**, the Seminoles went on an 8-0 run and took a 26-18 advantage with 6:24 remaining in the half.

Eshe powered in a short jumper on consecutive possessions to spark a 9-0 run during which Brooks, **Davis** and **Kim Critton** scored for the Gators to swing the lead back in UF's favor, 27-26, with 3:30 on the clock. But Holly Johnson came right back to end the run with a three-pointer. **Marsha Dotson** put in a short jumper on a pass from Davis to tie the score with 1:43 remaining, however, the Seminoles closed the half on a 7-2 march to take a 36-31 lead into the locker room after 11 lead changes in the opening 20 minutes.

Game 4: Florida 85, Stetson 56 November 27, 2005 • Gainesville, FL • O'Connell Center

All 11 Gators who played Sunday scored as the Florida women's basketball team notched an 85-56 win over Stetson in the 2005-06 home opener.

The Gators (3-1) were led by the hot hand of freshman **Sha Brooks**, who scored 17 of the Gators' first 22 points on 5-of-5 shooting from behind the arc. Brooks finished with a career-best 19 and was 5-of-7 from three-point land, while Florida seniors **Dalila Eshe** finished with 13 and **Brittany Davis** netted 11 to round out the Gators in double-figures.

"We saw that Sha was a great three-point shooter when we recruited her, and she knows what to do with the ball when it hits her hands," UF coach **Carolyn Peck** said. "She makes great shots whenever she gets open, and she's done a great job for us so far this season."

The Gators opened with a 13-1 run in the game's first five minutes powered by eight points from Brooks, who had already reset her career-high in points at the 6:30 mark of the opening period. After Brooks knocked down a three-pointer to push the Gators' lead out to 16-4, Stetson (0-3) never got closer than 11 at 19-8 for the remainder of the contest.

Florida played a near-flawless first half as they turned the ball over just twice while converting nine Stetson turnovers into 19 points. A stifling Florida defense kept the Stetson's offense off guard all half as the Hatters did not make a field goal until the 15:21 mark with a three-pointer from Sharnesha Smith.

For the half, Stetson shot just 33.3 percent from the field. On the opposite end, UF made 47.5 percent of its baskets en route to a 49-23 halftime lead. The Gators were 6-of-14 from three-point range in the first 20 minutes and outrebounded Stetson by a 27-16 margin.

Stetson had two players reach double-digits as senior Nefertiti Walker totaled 18 and Smith added 13.

"I thought we didn't defend very well in the first half," Stetson coach Dee Romine said. "On the other hand, I thought that the second half was the best half we have played all season. We came out and hit open shots, and we had a very good offensive flow the entire half."

The solid offensive play from UF extended into the second half as Florida narrowly missed school records in assists with 30 (31) and three-pointers made with eight (11).

The Gators finished the game with a season-high 45 rebounds, while the Hatters were only able to pull down 29. Florida had 32 points in the paint compared to 14 from Stetson, and the Gators' bench totaled 31 points in the win.

Game 5: Florida 93, Charlotte 80

November 30, 2005 • Charlotte, NC • Hulton Arena

Brittany Davis recorded career-highs of 23 points and 16 rebounds leading the University of Florida women's basketball team to a 93-80 victory over Charlotte (2-3) in front of a crowd of 3,693. The Gators (4-1) rallied from a 16-point second-half deficit to stage a tie for the third-largest comeback in program history.

Charlotte ripped out of the halftime locker room as Whitney Hoey canned a 3-pointer seconds into the period and sparked an 18-4 run to balloon a one-point lead to a 64-48 advantage with just under five minutes into the half. The 49ers dominated the boards during the run, 7-2, that included five on the offensive end which resulted in short put-backs. The Gators also committed five turnovers during that spell.

Florida regrouped and served up a 22-5 run during the next six-plus minutes to erase the deficit and take a 71-69 lead after Sha Brooks' three-pointer with 6:12 remaining. Depre Bowden came up with back-to-back steals at the end of that run that resulted in consecutive buckets for UF, one by Bowden herself and the other by Marshae Dotson, who powered back three straight offensive rebounds and finally got one to fall to get the Gators within one.

A three-point play by Sakellie Daniels swung the lead back to the 49ers, 72-71, and the teams traded leads for the next minute. With Charlotte holding a 76-75 advantage with 4:10 remaining, Brooks and Dalila Eshe sparked an 18-4 spree the rest of the way as the Gators played composed, hit their free throws and took control of the game en route to the 13-point win.

In the final 3:29 of the game, Florida hit 8-of-8 from the free throw line and outrebounded Charlotte 6-2 while keeping the 49ers without a field goal during the final game-ending run.

Eshe and Brooks both scored 18 points for the Gators, who shot 47.9 percent from the floor and 20-of-25 from the free throw line in the victory. Eshe, who scored eight of her points in the final two and half minutes of the game, also collected six rebounds and dished four assists.

The 49ers came out sizzling, hitting four of their first five shots to take a 10-5 lead in the first three minutes of the game. During that early stretch, the Gators hit 2-of-6 and committed four turnovers, but forced five Charlotte miscues as the pace was full court and frantic.

Florida came alive shortly afterwards, using a 15-4 run while shooting 6-of-10 from the floor over the next five and half minutes to take a 20-14 lead. Sha Brooks started the spree and scored five points during the run, while Brittany Davis scored six and Dalila Eshe and Danielle Santos each netted outside shots.

The Gators extended their early lead to nine points, 27-18, after an offensive put-back by Davis, but the personal fouls also started to mount and Charlotte took advantage at the free throw line, hitting the next three points of the game from the stripe. Pam Brown's driving layup cut UF's deficit to four, but Kim Dye sank a 3-pointer from the left corner and upped the lead to 30-23 with 7:30 remaining in the half. That trey was UF's lone points during the 49ers' 9-3 run, as the hosts clawed back to within three, 32-29, with 5:30 on the clock.

Davis, who contributed 17 points and eight rebounds in the first half, scored the next five points, including her second 3-pointer of the season, to build the lead to eight, 37-29, with 4:22 remaining. That's when Charlotte staged a 12-3 run during the next three minutes to take a 41-40 lead with 1:27 left in the period. The teams then traded baskets for the rest of the way, with Sabrina Gregory hitting a six-footer at the buzzer to give the 49ers a 45-44 halftime lead.

The teams shot nearly identical percentages from the floor during the first half, with Florida hitting 17 field goals including four 3-pointers compared with 15 field goals and three treys for Charlotte. The 49ers made up the difference at the free throw line, hitting 12-of-16 opposed to 6-of-9 for the Gators, who were whistled for 15 fouls in the opening 20 minutes.

Game 6: Florida 58, No. 18/16 Temple 55

December 3, 2005 • Philadelphia, Pa. • Liacouras Center

Dalila Eshe scored 20 points with eight rebounds and four steals leading the University of Florida women's basketball team to a 58-55 victory over No. 18/16 Temple (6-1).

Florida (5-1) led by seven points with just over four minutes remaining and staved off a furious comeback attempt to collected its first win over a ranked opponent since Feb. 29, 2004, when the Gators upset No. 18 Auburn on the road 71-60.

Senior forward Brittany Davis added 11 points with seven rebounds and three steals, while freshman Sha Brooks tallied 10 points for Florida, which shot 38.9 percent for the game and was outrebounded 38-33. The Gators' defense was the key, forcing 26 turnovers that they converted into 20 points. UF also held All-American Candice Dupree to just eight points on 4-of-11 shooting.

Kamesha Hairston was the only Owl in double-figures, scoring 24 points. Lady Comfort collected 10 rebounds for Temple, which shot 44.9 percent from the floor, including a 7-of-14 effort from the three-point line.

Temple scored the first four points of the second half, benefiting from two quick Gator turnovers to cut UF's lead to one, 34-33. Eshe hit a three-pointer from the top of the arc to start the scoring for the Gators, extending UF's lead back to four, 37-33, just two minutes into the half.

The Owls reduced UF's lead to one twice in the next minute and a half, but the Gators responded both times with a bucket. Jennifer Owens finally tied the game with a three-pointer before Kamesha Hairston came up with a steal on UF's ensuing possession and sank the layin to give Temple a 44-42 advantage, its first lead since early in the opening period. Danielle Santos hit a slashing jumper in the lane to tie the game with 11:44 remaining.

Florida turned the ball over seven times during the first 10 minutes of the second half and missed several short shots, but kept its composure and used a 7-2 run to turn a two-point Temple lead into a 49-46 advantage with under eight minutes remaining in the game.

The teams traded buckets before Eshe and Davis hit the next two field goals and extended UF's lead to seven, 55-48, with 4:10 remaining.

But Jennifer Owens ended Temple's offensive dry spell with a huge three-pointer with 2:33 on the clock, as the Owls closed within four, 55-51. The teams then traded turnovers on four straight possessions. Owens then hit one free throw to close the gap with 1:39 remaining. After UF missed a shot, Temple collected the rebound and missed one of its own. As Brittany Davis stood on the baseline to inbound the ball, Lady Comfort touched the ball which resulted in a technical foul and Danielle Santos hit the two free throws to bring the lead back to five, 57-52 with 1:10 on the clock. Davis added one free throw with 28 seconds remaining, before Kamesha Hairston sank three free throws after being fouled attempting a trey with 19.5 seconds left, cutting UF's lead to three, 58-55. Depre Bowden was fouled but missed the front end of a one-and-one with 12.3 ticks on the clock and Temple set up for the game-tying shot

Game 7: Florida 74, South Alabama 57

December 5, 2005 • Gainesville, Fla. • O'Connell Center

Senior **Brittany Davis** totaled 20 points and led 10 Gators in the scoring column while helping the University of Florida women's basketball team defeat South Alabama, 74-57.

Davis shot 90 percent (9-10) from the floor en route to notching her sixth consecutive double-figure scoring game and helping the Gators improve to 6-1, the best seven-game start under fourth-year head coach **Carolyn Peck**.

Senior **Danielle Santos** as well as freshman **Marshae Dotson** also reached double-figures with 12 and 10 points, respectively, against the Jaguars. Senior **Dalila Eshe** had another solid performance with nine points and seven rebounds, while **Sarah Lowe** added five points with six assists for the Gators, who shot a season-high 54 percent (27-50) from the floor, including a 65.4 percent clip in the second half.

"I was pleased with our defensive effort tonight," Peck said. "After coming back following a win at Temple on Saturday night, we didn't practice yesterday because I wanted the girls to catch their legs a little bit and study some film. I want us to continue building on our confidence that we are playing with right now."

The Jaguars (3-3) matched the Gators basket for basket throughout the game's first five minutes before UF broke open a 7-7 tie with a 12-2 run to push the score out to 19-9 with just under seven minutes remaining before the break.

Davis and Eshe combined for 11 of Florida's opening 15 points. The duo outscored the Jaguars entire team in the first 20 minutes as they combined for 17 first-half points. UF led 29-15 at the half after holding USA to 19.4 shooting from the field, including a dismal 8.3 percent (1-12) mark from beyond the arch.

It didn't take the Gators long to build on their lead in the second half, as the team came out and put together a 8-2 spurt in the first 2:30 of the half to extend their lead to 37-17. The Jaguars narrowed the margin in the second half as the Gators barely outscored them 45-42 in the final 20 minutes.

In the end, UF's defensive pressure and height under the basket proved to be too much for the Jaguars to handle as the Gators never led by fewer than 14 down the stretch. Florida forced 21 turnovers and outrebounded USA by a 36-30, including a 23-16 mark on the defensive boards.

JoAnne Williams led the Jaguars with 14 points, while Raena Eillis added 11 for USA which shot 34.5 percent (20-58) during the game and committed 21 turnovers that the Gators converted into 36 points.

Game 8: Florida 69, Illinois 64

December 9, 2005 • Gainesville, Fla. • O'Connell Center

Each of the Gator's four seniors had a big night in helping the Florida women's basketball team defeat Big Ten foe Illinois, 69-64. The Gators never trailed and improved to 7-1, their best start under head coach **Carolyn Peck**, while the Fighting Illini (5-3) saw their three-game win streak come to an end.

Seniors **Danielle Santos**, **Brittany Davis**, **Dalila Eshe** and **Sarah Lowe** each reached double figures in scoring, accounting for 57 of UF's 69 points.

Davis had her second career double-double with 14 rebounds and 12 points along with a career-high five steals. Santos led the squad with a season-high 18, while Eshe poured in 16 with eight rebounds and Lowe tallied 11 points with seven assists and five rebounds.

Lowe hit a pair of free throws with 13.5 seconds to play to ice the game and push her point total into the double-figures.

In the opening half, the Gators jumped out to a 16-4 lead after creating five Illini turnovers in the game's first six minutes. Illinois then put on a 7-0 run of their own to cut the score to 16-11 before Santos knocked down her second three-pointer of the half to push UF's lead back out to 19-11 with 11:10 on the clock.

Santos, Davis and Eshe scored 35 of the team's first-half points with each reaching double-figures prior to the intermission. Davis and Santos both had 12 while Eshe added 11. The trio was a combined 6-for-7 beyond the arch en route to UF's 41-31 advantage at the break.

Illinois came out of the locker room and switched from their zone coverage to man-to-man to subdue the Florida offense. The Illini opened the second half with a 15-8 run that included a 9-4 spurt powered by four points from Janelle Hughes, who finished with a team-high 18 points, to cut the Gators' lead to just three at 49-46 with less than 14 minutes to play.

The two teams continued to trade baskets until Hughes made a three-pointer to close the Florida gap to 53-52 with 10:25 left in the contest. Santos broke an almost six minute scoreless streak for the Gators with a jumper at the 7:12 mark to extend Florida's lead back to three at 55-52. UF led by as many as six down the stretch (67-61) and finished the game with a 14-9 run to reach the final score.

Florida tied their season-high with eight treys, matching their total set earlier this season against Stetson on Nov. 27. UF forced 16 UI turnovers while committing only 10 and outscored the Illini in points off possession by the same margin (16-10). The Gators connected on 11-of-14 free throws down the stretch to put away the Illini, despite being outscored 33-28 in the second half, when UF shot just 30.8 percent compared to the 46.2 clip by the visitors. The Illini won the battle for points in the paint (26-20) and the rebounding battle 41-36.

Game 9: Florida 59, Texas-Arlington 49

December 19, 2005 • Gainesville, Fla. • O'Connell Center

Senior **Dalila Eshe** scored a career-high 25 points with 11 rebounds and four blocks leading Florida to a 59-49 victory over Texas-Arlington on Monday evening.

The Gators, who were playing for the first time in 10 days, improved to 8-1, their best nine-game start under head coach **Carolyn Peck**. UF's current six-game win streak is tied for the longest in four years under Peck.

Joining Eshe with double-digits in the scoring column were **Brittany Davis**, who totaled 10 points and seven rebounds with three assists, while freshman **Sha Brooks** poured in 12, including a clutch three-pointer with 1:33 remaining.

Texas-Arlington (5-4) evened the score at 39-39 with 11:47 to play in the game after **Marynann Abanochi** knocked down the Mustangs' only try of the contest after 12 previous unsuccessful tries beyond the arch. After a pair of free throws from **Melanie Lane**, UTA took its first lead of the half, 41-39, with 10:43 left to play.

The Orange and Blue responded with a 20-10 spurt to finish the game. Florida retook the lead with less than nine minutes remaining and never looked back en route to the victory. Davis stopped a 4:29 scoreless drought for the Gators with a three-point play after pouring in a layup from underneath the basket and adding a free throw to bring Florida back to within one, 43-42.

Following Davis's three-point play, the Gators forced a UTA turnover and junior **Kim Dye** added her second 3-pointer to give UF the lead for good at 45-43.

Both teams got off to a sluggish start after the Gators connected on just one of their first six shots from the field. The Mustangs did not fare much better, connecting on only three of their first nine attempts as they paced themselves to a 6-2 lead. Eshe broke the UF slump with a jumper at the 14:58 mark to bring Florida back to within one at 6-5.

On UF's next possession, freshman Brooks drove to the lane and kissed a layup off the glass in traffic to give the Gators their first lead of the night at 7-6. The back-to-back baskets began a 15-5 run on six-of-seven shooting for the Gators as they took control of the game.

In the opening half, the Mustangs missed more shots (26) than the Gators attempted (19) as UT-Arlington hit 29.7 percent on 11-of-37 shooting from the field, including a 0-for-11 mark from beyond the arch, in the game's first 20 minutes.

UTA was 1-for-18 from three-point land for the game, registering a dismal 6 percent from beyond the arch.

All but two of UTA's first half baskets came from inside the paint. UTA's Terra Wallace knotted the score at 17-17 with a jump shot at the 5:49 mark to complete a 6-0 Mustang run. Wallace had a double-double, finishing the game with 12 points and 10 rebounds. Florida ended the half on a 10-6 spurt and went into the locker room ahead by a 27-23 margin.

The Gators finished the game with a slight edge in points off turnovers (17-15) despite losing the turnover battle 19-16. The Mustangs pulled down 12 more rebounds (44-32) and outscored the Gators 19-2 in second-chance points.

Game 10: Florida 73, Florida A&M 58

December 21, 2005 • Gainesville, Fla. • O'Connell Center

All 12 Gators scored and two totaled in double-digits as the Florida women's basketball squad defeated Florida A&M 73-58 in a Wednesday matinee at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

Gator freshman **Sha Brooks (Jackson, Tenn.)** led all scorers with a career-high 21 points on 8-of-13 shooting from the field including 5-of-8 three-pointers, while UF senior **Brittany Davis (Gainesville, Fla.)** poured in 16 with a game-high eight rebounds to improve Florida's record to 9-1, which includes a current streak of seven straight victories, the longest under head coach **Carolyn Peck**, who is in her fourth year with the Gators.

"I thought this was a good win from the standpoint that we were able to get a lot of playing time for several players," Peck said. "Everyone played well and played hard. This experience will pay off for us as the season goes along."

"We are very excited to have nine wins prior to the Christmas break. This senior class only reached nine wins total in their first season here, and I wanted them to realize how much the freshman and sophomore classes have helped them reach that win total before we broke for the holidays."

The Rattlers (2-6) came out with an aggressive pressure defense that forced nine Gator turnovers in the first half. The game was tied three times and featured four lead changes in the first 10 minutes. After Davis made a layup with 9:53 remaining in the period to put the Gators up 21-19, Florida never looked back and led by as many as 15 during a 24-9 run to close the half.

Florida made the most of eight Florida A&M first-half fouls, going 10-of-12 from the charity stripe en route to a 43-28 halftime lead. Ten different Gators registered points in the first 20 minutes, led by Brooks with 12, a total that included three clutch treys.

"Sha is a little under the weather right now, and I thought she played a tremendous game for us today," Peck added. "With this being our last game before Christmas and knowing that the girls have a couple of days off, most players would take this game off being under the weather. Sha played hard from start to finish today, and I'm proud of her for it."

A trio of FAMU players reached double-figures as Deidra Jones (19), Q'Vaunda Curry (15) and LaKeisha Alexander (12) led a Rattlers attack that shot 38.2 percent from the floor while hitting 8-of-20 from the three-point arc.

Florida won the rebounding battle 40-32, which included a very balanced attack on the boards with 22 coming on the defensive side and 18 coming off missed shots. After giving up 24 offensive rebounds to Texas-Arlington earlier in the week, the Gators limited the Rattlers to only 13.

"We had a challenge to limit our opponent to 13 offensive rebounds today," Peck said. "We did a good job of reaching that goal. We had a very high accountability in our players to make sure this goal was met."

Game 11: Florida 76, Rhode Island 62

Dec. 28, 2005 • Gainesville, Fla. • O'Connell Center • State Farm Classic 1st Rd

Brittany Davis recorded her third career double-double with 17 points and 11 rebounds in helping Florida win 10 of its first 11 games for just the fourth time in school history as the Gators defeated Rhode Island 76-62 in the opening round of the 15th annual State Farm Classic at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

In a somewhat sloppy game that featured a combined 63 turnovers and 29 steals by the two teams, Florida (10-1) came out on top by out-scoring the Rams (3-6) by 19 points in the opening half and by sinking 25-of-32 free throws (78.1 percent) in the game as UF matched 10-1 starts by the 2001, 1996 and 1985 teams.

Sha Brooks added 11 points, while **Sarah Lowe** chipped in a season-best 11 points and six assists, while also collecting four steals as Florida extended its winning streak to eight games – the longest stretch in Peck's tenure in Gainesville.

After trailing by 19 at the break, the Rams refused to go away and scored eight of the first 10 points in the second half to come within 13 at 51-38 with 16:51 left to play. Rhode Island cut the lead further after a basket at the 14:37 mark made the score 52-43 in favor of the Gators.

Florida responded with a quick 6-0 run in just 1:48 as Lowe canned a jumper, which was followed by a **Dalila Eshe** basket and another Davis two-pointer as UF's lead increased to 15 at 58-43 with 11:52 remaining.

The Gators suffered through a field goal drought and Rhode Island slowly crept back. After Rhodes completed a three-point play with 4:04 left to play, the Rams had cut the lead to just seven at 63-56.

Brooks then came alive for the Gators – she scored 10 of her 11 points in the final 4:23 of the game – as she hit two free throws to push Florida's advantage back to nine at 65-56 with 3:54 left. Davis hit a pair from the charity stripe to give the Gators an 11-point lead at 67-56 at the 3:30 mark.

The teams traded points with Brooks notching a pair of free throws and a bucket before a Rhode Island two-pointer made it 71-62 with 1:50 left. Florida then sealed the game as **Kim Dye** sank a trey from the corner before a UF steal and Brooks jumper gave the Gators a 76-62 advantage with 1:24 left.

In finishing with six assists, Lowe became just the ninth Gator to reach 300 in a career. Eshe picked up eight points to amass 500 in her career, while Davis crossed the 400 rebound plateau in her career.

After struggling somewhat through the opening eight minutes of the first half, the Gators found themselves trailing Rhode Island 16-15 with 11:45 remaining, but UF poured it on in the final 11 minutes in out-scoring the Rams 34-14 the rest of the way in taking a 49-30 lead into the half.

Florida's 49 points matched a season-best in the opening half as the Gators hit on 16-of-30 shots (53.3 percent), while making good on 13-of-17 free throws (76.5 percent).

Following a Rhode Island bucket at 11:45, the Rams regained the lead at 16-15. But Florida responded with a nine of the next 11 points in moving on top 26-17 with 9:17 left. Following a trey by **Depre Bowden**, the Gators led 29-18 with 8:25 to go. But the Rams mounted a comeback with five straight points to close the gap to five at 29-24 with 6:36 left. The Gators responded with seven points in the next 1:27, which set the tone for a 17-2 run in a span of 4:22 as UF's advantage swelled to 20 at 46-26 with 2:02 left. Lowe had eight points to lead the Gators in the stretch.

Game 12: Florida 73, Liberty 50

Dec. 29, 2005 • Gainesville, Fl. • O'Connell Center • State Farm Classic 2nd Rd

Sha Brooks scored a career-high 22 points and pulled down a career-best eight rebounds in leading Florida to its ninth straight win and its 13th State Farm Classic title in the 15-year history of the event as the Gators defeated Liberty 73-50.

Florida (11-1) matched three other teams in school history for the program's best start after 12 games by using a critical 14-0 run midway through the second half in turning the tables on Liberty (5-4), which had never previously trailed in the contest. The Gators out-scored the Flames 47-20 in the second half as UF connected on 14-of-28 shots, while hitting a season-best 26-of-30 free throws in the game (86.7 percent).

The Gators became just the third team to out-rebound Liberty this season as UF finished with 44 to 29 for the Flames. In winning its ninth consecutive game, Florida matched the second-longest winning streak in school history – just three shy of the school record of 12 set during the 1993-94 season. The Gators hadn't won nine in a row since 2000-01.

Dalila Eshe added 13 points, including a 9-of-10 effort from the free throw line, and eight rebounds for the Gators, while **Brittany Davis** chipped in with 10 points and seven boards. Davis crossed the 600-point career mark in the game after finishing in double figures for the 11th straight contest. Brooks, who also collected a game-high six steals, led UF's march at the free throw line hitting 11-of-12, with the Gators capping 26-of-30 during the contest.

Karolina Piotrkiewicz and Roli-Ann Nikagbatse paced Liberty with eight points each, while the Gators held the Flames' leading scorer, Megan Frazee (20.6 ppg), to just seven points on 3-of-10 shooting.

With the Flames holding a six-point lead at 40-34 with 14:36 left in the game, the Gators mounted a 14-0 run in a span of 4:21 in forging ahead 48-34 with 9:47 remaining. Five different players scored for UF in the stretch, led by Davis, who got things going with a basket at the 14:08 mark. Davis had five points in the run, while Brooks added four and provided a pair of free throws with 12:05 left as the Gators took their first lead of the game at 42-40 and never looked back.

Florida held Liberty scoreless for a 6:12 stretch as the Flames failed to record points on 11 consecutive possessions and went 0-for-10 from the floor in the stretch. Liberty came as close as five after a trey from Nikagbatse with 8:24 left, but the Gators poured on the offense the rest of the way in scoring on six of its next possession to seal the game.

The Gators scored a season-low 26 points in the first half and found themselves trailing Liberty 30-26 after making just 8-of-26 shots (30.8 percent) after 20 minutes of action. The Flames opened the contest by scoring nine of the first 11 points in bolting to a 9-2 lead with 15:58 left.

Florida fought back and remained close throughout the first frame as the Gators never trailed by more than eight. With the score 24-16 following a Liberty bucket at the 5:23 mark, UF answered with an 8-0 run in just 1:42 to tie the game for the first time. Four players scored points in the stretch with **Sarah Lowe** picking up the basket that led to a tie with 3:18 left. Liberty responded with six consecutive points before **Danielle Santos** canned a jumper with 34 seconds left to bring the scoring in the half to a close.

Game 13: Florida 72, Florida State 62 January 2, 2006 • Gainesville, Fla. • O'Connell Center

Brittany Davis recorded her fourth career double-double with 16 points and 11 rebounds as Florida avenged its only loss of the season in coming back from an 11-point second-half deficit in defeating Florida State 72-62.

Florida (12-1) became just the fourth team in school history to start a season with 12 wins in its first 13 games in handing Florida State (9-4) its 17th loss in the last 19 contests in the series between the two teams.

The Gators forced 14 turnovers and picked up 10 steals in the second half, while sinking 14-of-24 shots (58.3 percent) after the break as Florida enters the Southeastern Conference schedule having won 10-straight contests – the second-longest streak in school history.

Depre Bowden added a career-high 15 points on 6-of-9 shooting for the Gators, while Marshae Dotson chimed in with a career-best 14 points on a perfect 7-for-7 night from the field and collecting seven rebounds. Sha Brooks also ended the contest in double figures with 13 points.

Davis extended her streak of consecutive games in double-figure scoring to 12, while Brooks pushed her stretch to five straight contests. The Gator bench also outscored Florida State 29-2, led by Bowden and Dotson's output.

Laquinta Neely paced Florida State with 15 points. The Gators hauled in 37 rebounds to 29 for Florida State – just the third time this season the Seminoles have been out-rebounded.

The Gators turned the tables on the Seminoles in the second half by using a 15-0 run in going from down 11 to up by four as UF turned up its defensive intensity in forcing six turnovers during the stretch, while Florida State went without a field goal for more than nine minutes.

The Seminoles started strong with nine of the first 11 points in the second half in again moving on top by 11 at 39-28 and later 41-30 with 15:15 left to play.

But Florida then clamped down defensively as Florida State failed to score on its next 12 possessions, while the Gator offensive flourished. A layup by Bowden at the 13:57 mark got things going before UF went on to tally the next 13 points.

Six different Gators scored in the 15-0 run, led by Davis who notched five, three of which came the seventh try of her career. Florida took its first lead since 9-8 after Davis canned the first of a pair of free throws at 42-41 with 9:05 left and the Gators didn't relinquish the advantage the rest of the game.

Florida State finally ended its drought with a basket to cut UF's lead to two at 45-43 with 7:40 left, but the Gators answered with eight of the next 10 points in forging ahead 53-45 with 5:24 remaining after another Bowden layup.

FSU refused to go away and narrowed the gap to just four at 62-58 with 1:32 left, but Brooks effectively sealed the game with a three-pointer from the top of the key with 1:11 to play to give UF an insurmountable cushion of seven at 65-58.

After making good on just 11-of-30 shots in the first half, the Gators found themselves trailing Florida State 30-25 at the break. But a late 10-0 helped Florida reduce what had grown as large as an 11-point lead for the Seminoles.

The score was close in the opening stages before Florida State gradually pulled away, using a 6-0 run in building an 11-point advantage at 26-15 with 6:07 left in the half. But the Gators responded as a layup by Bowden with 5:49 left ignited a 10-0 UF run.

Dalila Eshe tallied her third career double-double, helping Florida open Southeastern Conference action with a 59-44 victory over Alabama Thursday evening at the O'Connell Center.

The Crimson Tide (6-8, 0-1 SEC) scored the first bucket of the second half to extend their lead to 11 points, 30-19, but the Gators (13-1, 1-0 SEC) regrouped quickly to outscore the Tide 40-14 the rest of the way and notch their 11th straight win and tie the program record for the best 14-game record with the 2001 squad. Alabama lost its 19th consecutive SEC road game.

"You are always happy to take the 'W' any way you can get it," Florida head coach Carolyn Peck said. "The one thing that I like about this team is that they do a good job of fighting back. The one thing that I don't like about this team is that they find themselves in a position to where they have to fight back. In the second half, we were able to pick up our momentum and did a better job of finding our open shots."

Senior Brittany Davis started UF's comeback with a short jumper in the paint and Sha Brooks followed with two three-pointers to bring the Gators within one with just under 16 minutes remaining. Alabama responded with a layup by Leah Drury and UF countered again, closing to within one point twice more before junior Kim Dye canned back-to-back three-pointers with 10:03 remaining to give the Gators a 41-36 advantage after trailing for the previous 24:54 of play.

Florida never lost the lead again, shooting 51.7 percent in the second half and holding Alabama to a 25 percent clip during the final 20 minutes and 29.8 percent for the game.

Davis led the Gators with 16 points, while Eshe tallied 11 points with a career-high 14 rebounds and Brooks contributed 11 of her 14 points in the second half.

Marverly Nettles led the Tide with 12 points, and Kate Mastin finished with 11 – all coming in the game's opening 20 minutes. The 44 points scored by the Tide was a season-low for a Gator opponent this season as they failed to score in the final 3:51 of the game.

The Gators got off to a rough start, connecting on 9-of-30 of their first half shots for a 30 percent success rate from the field. This included a dismal 1-of-10 performance from three-point land. Alabama's Kate Mastin scored 11 points, helping the Tide close the first half on a 10-2 run and take a 28-19 halftime lead.

Game 15: No. 17/18 Georgia 89, No. -/25 Florida 70 January 8, 2006 • Athens, Ga. • Stegeman Coliseum

Georgia scored the first 11 points of the second half to balloon its 11-point halftime lead into a 56-34 advantage and Florida would never recover, as the 17th-ranked Lady Bulldogs defeated the Gators 89-70 at Stegeman Coliseum Sunday afternoon in front of 6,178.

The loss snapped the Gator's 11-game win streak, one shy of tying the program record, as Florida (13-2, 1-1 SEC) lost just its second game of the year and its first since a November 23 decision at Florida State. UF's 13-1 start was tied for the best in program history. The 2001 squad also began the season 13-1, but ironically lost to Georgia in its 15th game that year, as well.

Dalila Eshe led Florida with 23 points and 10 rebounds to post her third double-double this season and the fourth of her career. Freshman Marshae Doston also recorded the first double-double of her young career, contributing 11 points with a career-best 10 boards, hitting 5-of-8 from the field, as UF shot just 39.4 percent from the floor. Freshman Sha Brooks tallied 14 points to score in double-figures for the seventh straight game.

Georgia's Tasha Humphrey scored 19 of her game-high 26 points in the second half, when the Lady Bulldogs (11-3, 2-0 SEC) out-rebounded the Gators by 14. Georgia connected on 11-of-23 three-pointers and finished the day shooting 48.6 percent overall from the floor. Sherill Baker also netted 20 points for UG, while Cori Chambers and Janese Hardrick each contributed 13.

Sarah Lowe's three-pointer with 15 minutes remaining was the Gator's first field goal of the second half, as UF attempted to rally in the second half for the third consecutive game but fell short. Lowe's trey was part of a 6-0 run that cut the deficit to 16 points, but Georgia staged another run to take a 20-point lead which it held until Sha Brooks canned two free throws with 3:03 remaining to make the score 82-63. Dalila Eshe added an eight-foot jumper, but Janese Hardrick countered with a four-point play. Eshe continued to hit from the outside, canning a three-pointer and another long jumper to bring the Gators within 16 points with 1:51.

The opening minutes of the first half were played fast and furious, with both teams trading baskets and forcing five lead changes and one tie in the first four minutes. Eshe's 3-pointer gave the Gators a 9-7 lead, but Georgia ripped off a 10-0 run over the next two minutes to take a 17-9 advantage with 13:57 on the clock.

UF chipped away and got within six points twice, but Georgia responded with a three-pointer both times, leading by as many as 13 points on two different occasions, last coming with 1:19 remaining in the period. Dotson canned consecutive offensive put-backs to get UF within nine, 43-34, with 15 seconds remaining, but Alexis Kendrick's jumper with two seconds left gave Georgia a 43-34 halftime lead. It was the third consecutive game the Gators had trailed after the first 20 minutes of play, but Florida couldn't stage another.

The Dawgs shot a sizzling 7-of-13 from the three-point arc in the first half and 50 percent overall, while Florida hit 40 percent on 14-of-35 shooting. Chambers and Janese Hardrick each connected on three treys for Georgia. Eshe led Florida with 10 points, while Dotson had nine points with a career-high eight rebounds.

Game 16: Kentucky 80, No. -/24 Florida 65

Danielle Santos had a big night, narrowly missing her first career double-double while senior forward Dalila Eshe (Tallahassee) scored a game-high 23 points, but it was not enough as the Florida women's basketball team dropped an 80-65 decision to Kentucky at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center Thursday evening.

The loss was the second consecutive for Florida (13-3, 1-2 SEC), which had its nine-game home winning streak snapped.

Jenny Pfeiffer's season-high 23 points led UK (12-3, 2-1 SEC), which had four players reach double-figures. Eleina Roddy posted a double-double with 14 boards and 10 points, while Carly Ormerod poured in 16 points and Samantha Mahoney totaled 13 on the evening. All but one Wildcat pulled down a rebound, and Jennifer Humphrey grabbed 19 rebounds alone for Kentucky which out-rebounded Florida 55-39. The bulk of Pfeiffer's point total came from six three-pointers, helping the Wildcats hit nine during the game and shoot 42.4 percent for the game, including a 48.4 percent clip in the second half.

Despite trailing 13-9 early on in the contest, Kentucky put together a 16-5 run over a seven minute stretch in the first half to take control of the game. Santos knotted the score at 33-33 with a three-pointer at the 1:12 mark, but the Wildcats hit the final shot of the period to take a 35-33 lead at halftime, UF's fifth consecutive game trailing after the first 20 minutes.

"I don't think we maintained the level of intensity like Kentucky tonight," coach Carolyn Peck said. "Lots of games are decided by intensity in the second half. Their intensity was very good in the second half. They got several second chance shots, while we didn't. They did a good job of capitalizing on our mistakes."

The Gators made just 12 of their 33 first half shots and were only 1-of-6 from beyond the arc in the game's opening 20 minutes and fell behind by as many as 11 at 33-22. However, the Orange and Blue was still able to tie the score at 33-33 before the Wildcats added a lay-up at the buzzer to take a 35-33 lead into the locker room.

The second half wasn't much better for the UF offense. The Wildcats stormed out of the locker room in the second half, scoring 13 of the period's first 20 points to stretch their lead back out to eight at 48-40. UF, which got within three points three times during the final period, shot a dismal 28.6 (10-of-35) from the field while UK countered with a 48.4 percent mark (15-of-31) as they ran away in the end.

Kentucky out-rebounded Florida 55-39 and outscored 16-11 in second chance points. The Wildcats also received 36 points off their bench, while Florida was only able to get 11 from the non-starters.

Santos finished the night with 10 points and a career-high nine rebounds, while Brittany Davis added 15 and extended her streak at the free throw line to 21 consecutive makes.

Game 17: Florida 66, Mississippi 58 January 19, 2006 * Oxford, Miss. * Tad Smith Coliseum

Senior **Danielle Santos** scored nine points during a 13-1 run late in the game to lead the University of Florida women's basketball team defeated Ole Miss 66-58.

With Ole Miss (11-6, 1-3 SEC) holding a four-point lead with just under nine minutes remaining, Santos exploded with three consecutive three-pointers and then hit another to give the Gators (14-3, 2-2 SEC) the lead for good and their first Southeastern Conference road win.

Santos finished the game with 13 points and a career-high 13 rebounds to record her first career double-double. She also dished a game-high seven assists for the Gators, who shot 39.3 percent, including a 42.4 percent mark in the second half when UF outscored UM 46-36.

Santos was one of three Gators who posted double-doubles, as senior **Dalila Eshe** contributed a team-high 14 points with 11 rebounds and freshman **Marshae Dotson** added 13 points and 10 rebounds in 15 minutes of play. **Brittany Davis** also tallied 15 points in the win for UF which snapped a two-game losing streak and posted its first victory over former head coach Carol Ross.

UM's Carla Bartee led all scorers with 20 points, while Danetra Forrest added 19 points with 14 rebounds for the Lady Rebels, who shot just 29.5 percent in the game, while holding a slim 52-50 rebounding edge. Armintie Price collected a game-high 14 rebounds for UM, which scored 20 second-chance points.

Eshe scored the first points of the second half to tie the game at 22-all, but Bartee sank a three-pointer and Price hit one free throw to give the Lady Rebels a 26-22 lead. UF turned the ball over on its next possession and the momentum seemed to be in favor of Ole Miss. But the Gators forced a stop on the defensive end and Eshe snared her 10th rebound of the game and put back the offensive board. **Davis** followed with a three-point play to give the Gators the lead, 27-26.

The lead changed hands on the next three possessions and the game had two tied scores during this two and half minute span before **Dotson** converted another three-point play for Florida and then hit another short jumper to give the Gators a 35-32 lead with 12 minutes remaining. But Tasi Worsham canned a trey to tie the game. **Sarah Lowe** netted four straight free throws between a UM bucket before Bartee nailed a three-pointer and Danetra Forrest converted a three-point play for UM to swing the advantage back to the hosts, 43-39, with 8:52 remaining.

The Gators missed their first 11 three-point attempts before **Santos** nailed one from the right corner in front of UF's bench. Eshe followed with an offensive put-back before Santos canned another from beyond the arc. UM got one free throw from Price, before Santos stroked the long ball again to give the Gators a 50-44 lead with 6:25 on the clock. Eshe converted a pair from the charity stripe on the next series and extended UF's lead to eight, 52-44. After two Rebel free throws, Santos hit her fourth trey during the spree, as the Gators claimed a 55-46 lead. Bartee answered with a trey for UM, but **Davis** put back in a miss to keep UF's advantage, 57-49 with 4:23 left. Eshe followed with two free throws and the Gators had a 59-49 advantage with 3:58 remaining. But UM staged a rally, as Danetra Forrest put back an offensive rebound and Bartee followed with a three-pointer to close the gap to five, 59-54, with just over three minutes remaining.

UF worked the shot clock to perfection on its next possession, as Eshe hit a jumper in the paint with two seconds left, giving UF a 61-54 lead. But Eshe fouled out on the ensuing series, as Forrest made the shot, but missed the free throw and UM was within five, 61-56 with 1:50 left.

The teams traded misses before Lowe grabbed a defensive board a streaked the length of the court and dropped in a layin to extend the lead back to seven with 48 seconds left, as UF hit 3-of-4 free throws the rest of the way to secure the victory.

Game 18: Florida 73, No. 19 Vanderbilt 59 January 22, 2006 * Gainesville, Fla. * O'Connell Center

Marshae Dotson and junior **Kim Dye** posted career high scoring efforts helping the University of Florida women's basketball team upset 19th-ranked Vanderbilt, 73-59, Sunday afternoon at the O'Connell Center in front of 2,813.

Senior **Danielle Santos** (**Marietta, Ga.**), who finished the game with 10 points, scored five points during the Gators' 9-0 run to start the second half and erase an eight-point halftime deficit and take a 35-34 lead with 17:49 remaining.

Vanderbilt (13-6, 2-3 SEC) answered the run with jumpers from Carla Thomas and Liz Sherwood, but **Sha Brooks** (**Jackson, Tenn.**) nailed a three-pointer to tie the game, which would see three more tied scores over the next four minutes.

With the Commodores holding a 45-43 lead with 11:31 left, Dotson powered in a layup to spark a 19-5 run that lifted Florida (15-3, 3-2 SEC) to a 62-49 advantage with 4:45 remaining in the game and maintained a double-figure lead the rest of the way en route to the victory.

"My team gave me a great birthday present," said UF coach **Carolyn Peck**, who was celebrating her 40th birthday facing her alma mater. "They are a special group. They came out with a lot of heart. We knew it was a game we would have to battle in, defensively. Marshae (Dotson) and Kim (Dye) really helped swing the momentum our way in the second half."

Dotson finished with 17 points on 5-of-5 shooting from the floor and 7-of-9 from the free throw line in 17 minutes of action, while Dye hit for 15 points, canning 5-of-7 from the three-point arc. Senior **Brittany Davis** (**Gainesville, Fla.**) had nine points and a team-high seven rebounds for Florida, which outscored Vanderbilt 47-25 in the second half when the Gators shot 57.7 percent and held the usually accurate Commodores to a 37 percent mark.

In the first half, the Gators shot a dreadful 25 percent (6-24) from the floor, but were within eight points at halftime despite Vanderbilt's 62.5 percent (15-24) shooting efforts.

Vanderbilt was led by junior Caroline Williams, who totaled 17 points and six rebounds on the afternoon. Carla Thomas and Nicole Jules also reached double figures with 14 and 13, respectively.

Florida let a 10-point lead midway through the second half disappear, as sharp shooting Arkansas nailed 11 three-pointers en route to a 69-63 upset Thursday night at Bud Walton Arena. The Lady Razorbacks, who have hit 47 three-pointers in the last four games, also overcame a 14-point deficit in the first half and carried that momentum into the second half where they shot 46.7 percent from the floor and canned 6-of-10 three-pointers. "For the first 17 minutes we played some pretty good basketball, but with three minutes left, Arkansas picked up its defensive intensity, we rocked back on our heels and the momentum swung their way," UF coach **Carolyn Peck** said. "I thought we got some of that momentum back early in the second half, but down the stretch, we lost our focus. It was a breakdown in concentration on our part and in this game, the team that concentrates the longest is going to win. That's what Arkansas did today."

Dalila Eshe's 17 points led the Gators (15-4, 3-3 SEC), who also got double-figure scoring from **Danielle Santos** (11) and **Brittany Davis** (10). Florida shot 45.1 percent (23-51) from the floor, but Arkansas, which shot 39.3 percent, managed 10 more shots and capitalized from long range. UA's Leslie Howard scored a game-high 24 points, hitting 6-of-10 three-pointers, while Brittney Vaughn tallied 10 points with six assists.

Arkansas scored the first five points of the second half to take its first lead of the game, 32-30, but **Dalila Eshe** came right back with a three-pointer from the top of the arc to spark a 17-5 run, as the Gators regained the lead and took a 47-37 advantage with 13:16 remaining.

Similar to the first half, just as the Gators seemed to pull away, turnovers plagued their game and Arkansas took advantage with a 15-4 spree to retake the lead, 52-51, with just less than seven minutes left.

Danielle Santos hit an eight-foot jumper to give the Gators the lead, but Leslie Howard nailed UA's ninth trey of the game as the Lady Razorbacks took the lead, 55-53. Marshae Dotson's offensive tip-tied the game, but UA responded as the teams continued to trade two points with the home team taking the lead and forcing the Gators to match.

Howard then nailed a trey from the left baseline to give UA a 59-56 lead with 1:56 remaining. Santos hit a jumper with get the Gators within one, 62-61, with 1:39 on the clock. But Howard struck again and canned her sixth three-pointer to extend UA's lead to 65-61 with 44 seconds remaining. **Sha Brooks** hit two free throws, but Howard did, too to keep the difference four points. Brooks then missed the front end of a 1-and-1 and Arkansas collected the miss and the Gators were forced to foul.

Florida roared out of the gate, opening the game with a quick 8-0 run. Arkansas zipped right back to tie the game at 12-12 with 15:35 on the clock, as its first four field goals were three-pointers, two each from Rochelle Vaughn and Leslie Howard. The Gators continued to work the ball inside against the smaller Lady 'Bacs, with **Eshe** hitting a layup and **Sarah Lowe** and **Santos** each making their way to the free throw stripe before Eshe connected on another short jumper to build a seven-point advantage, 19-12, with 13:23 remaining in the period.

Dotson ended a five-minute scoring drought in the game by sinking an athletic jumper in the lane to extend UF's lead to nine, 21-12, with just over eight minutes remaining. Dotson then hit a pair of free throws to give the Gators an 11-point advantage. Melissa Hobbs ended the eight-minute drought for Arkansas by canning a 15-footer, but Florida marched right back with Eshe hitting a finesse move inside and Santos working an inside-outside game with Davis to perfection by canning a three-pointer, as the Gator lead swelled to 14, 28-14.

The teams then traded buckets, with the Gators' coming from Davis with 4:42 on the clock to keep the lead at 14 points, but those would be UF's last points of the half, as Arkansas refused to fold, and turned up its defense, forcing six Gator turnovers and sinking some second chance points to stage an 11-0 run with scoring from five different players in the final 3:03 of the half to cut UF's deficit to three points, 30-27, entering the locker room.

The No. 24 Florida women's basketball team turned the ball over 25 times in a 92-55 loss to No. 15 Georgia Sunday afternoon at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

Lady Bulldogs forward Tasha Humphrey turned in a 30-point, 10-rebound, six-steal performance to lead Georgia (14-6, 5-2 SEC) to the decisive victory and sweep the season series against the Gators, who lost for the second straight time and fell to 15-5 overall, 3-4 in SEC action.

With the fourth 30-point performance of her career, Humphrey surpassed the 1,000-career point mark, shooting 11-21 from the field and a perfect 8-of-8 at the free-throw line. Another milestone in the game was produced by Georgia senior Sherill Baker, whose first of five steals on Sunday broke the SEC record for career thefts, surpassing the 372 collected by former Mississippi State standout Tan White.

Senior **Danielle Santos** (Marietta, Ga.) had 17 points, but was the only player to reach double figures for the Gators, who shot 39.3 percent (22-56) from the floor and had a 34-33 rebounding edge in the game.

Georgia used five players in double figures to outscore Florida 45-26 in the second half, shooting 58 percent after the break. The Lady Dawgs gained 34 points off of Gator turnovers in the game, just three points shy of the margin of victory. Georgia also outscored Florida in the paint 46-20. "When you look at the multiple turnovers, we all played a part in it," UF head coach **Carolyn Peck** said. "We didn't demonstrate that we were prepared. It was a big step backward for the Gators today. We switched up our defense at the beginning. Tasha (Humphrey) was just scoring inside, so we were doing a good job of defending the threes. But, when you turn the ball over, it doesn't matter what defense you're in."

Florida traded buckets with Georgia early in the game, exchanging leads five times. A three-pointer by UF senior **Sarah Lowe** (Wynnewood, Pa.) gave the Gators a 17-13 lead with 11:36 left in the first half, by Georgia exploded with a devastating 18-2 run over the next four minutes to take a 31-19 lead, en route to a 47-29 halftime advantage.

Sha Brooks' 16 points led five Gators in double-figure scoring, helping the University of Florida women's basketball team defeat Auburn, 72-61.

Brooks broke out of a mini scoring slump, reaching double-figures for the first time in six games. She scored 15 of her 16 points from behind the three-point arc, while tying UF's freshman record with five treys in a game, hitting 5-of-12 from long range.

Florida's four other double-figure scorers all were seniors. Brittany Davis added 13 points and six rebounds, while Sarah Lowe posted 11 points for the Gators, dished six assists and had a game-high five steals. Dalila Eshe chipped in 10 points, all of which came on perfect shooting from the charity stripe, as she extended her free throws made streak to 25. Danielle Santos scored in double figures for the sixth-straight time, recording 10 points, as well as three rebounds.

"I think our veteran players did a great job for us tonight," UF head coach Carolyn Peck said. "Dalila was solid inside and did a good job of posting up. There was a huge size difference inside and they had the obvious advantage. But we did a good job of attacking the basket and keeping the ball in our possession when we had it."

Florida jumped out to a quick 5-0 lead to start the game and made it rain threes, scoring 24 of its 35 first half points from behind the arc, hitting 8-of-18.

The two teams traded shots throughout the first half, as Auburn took its first lead of the game at the 8:21 mark after a couple free throws by KeKe Carrier. A 10-0 run by the Tigers put Auburn up 27-20 with 7:05 remaining, but the Orange and Blue battled back scoring 11 unanswered points of its own to take a 40-35 lead into the locker room at the break.

The Gators maintained their lead throughout the second half and slowly shut the door on Auburn with scoring runs of 7-0 and 7-2. Peck lauded the team as a whole for its offensive attack on the court, Lowe in particular.

"One of the things we really focus on is building our offense and trying to erase the turnovers," Peck said. "Our players were confident when they were shooting and Sarah Lowe did a great job of pushing the ball in transition. We tweaked our offense a little for this game and did a better job of passing and sharing and moving the basketball."

The Gators took advantage of 22 Tiger turnovers to convert 26 points from the giveaways. Conversely, UF kept the turnover column to a season low of seven, after coming off their 25 turnover performance against Georgia on Sunday. Florida shot 34.6 percent from three-point range (9-26), compared to 25 percent (3-12) by Auburn and sank 21-of-27 free throws, while the Tigers finished 10-for-15 from the charity stripe.

Auburn was led by Carrier, who scored a game-high 24 points, while Marita Payne added 10 points, seven rebounds and six blocks.

Sha Brooks' 21 points while the Gators' four seniors combined for 41 points leading Florida to a 68-61 upset over No. 21/23 Kentucky in front of a Memorial Coliseum crowd of 5,950.

Dalila Eshe contributed 17 points, hitting all seven of her free throw attempts to extend her made streak to 32, while Brittany Davis posted her fifth double-double of the season and her career with 12 points and 13 rebounds. Sarah Lowe, who played all 40 minutes, added seven points with seven assists, while Danielle Santos posted five points with six rebounds in 38 minutes of action.

Neither team was able to mount a significant lead in the game, which featured 10 lead changes and five tied scores. The last tie came with just under eight minutes remaining when Eshe scored the first four points in a mini 7-2 run that proved to be the difference, as the Gators never trailed again en route to the win.

Florida was able to produce its seven win this season after trailing at halftime, outscoring the Wildcats 39-30 in the final 20 minutes when they shot 37.5 percent (12-32) and held Kentucky to a 27.6 percent (8-29) shooting mark. The Wildcats did hold a 47-40 rebounding advantage, but it was much better than the 16-rebound edge UK had in the first meeting.

Brooks hit the first field goal of the second half to tie the game, before UK stepped up its rebounding effort which resulted in the next four points. But Marshae Dotson's offensive putback sparked a 6-0 run, capped by a pair of buckets by Eshe to swing the advantage back UK's way, 37-35, with 16:15 remaining. The Wildcats scored the next three points before Davis hit a short jumper off a pass from Depre Bowden and the lead change continued.

Eshe then converted a three-point play and hit another inside bucket as part of UF's 9-2 run that resulted in a 46-40 lead with 12:20 left after Lowe found a streaking Bowden for a layup.

Sarah Elliott finally hit UK's first field in nearly four minutes, also converting a three-point play, before Carly Ormerod canned two free throws that cut UF's lead to one, 46-45, with 10:26 left. Brooks hit a slashing layup to give the Gators a slight cushion and the teams traded free throws before Samantha Mahoney hit an inside jumper, as UF's leads shrank to 49-48 with 9:10 remaining. Nastassia Alcius hit one from the charity strip to tie the game, before Eshe countered with four straight from the line, extending her made free throw streak to 32 and giving UF a 53-49 lead with 6:33 on the clock.

Alcius worked a back-door play with Humphrey to perfection and UK closed within two before Florida got a bucket from Santos and one free throw from Davis to climb to 56-51 with 4:05 remaining. Mahoney hit a shot for the Wildcats and excited the crowd, but Davis sank a 10-foot hook shot with just under three minutes left to draw the lead back to five with just under three minutes remaining. Alcius followed with a 12-footer from the left corner, but Brooks converted a three-point play after a slashing layup and Lowe followed with two free throws with 53 ticks left, as UF's lead grew to eight, 63-55. Jenny Pfeiffer nailed three free throws with 10 seconds remaining, but Brooks polished off the game with a pair from the stripe to end the scoring.

Samantha Mahoney led UK with 12 points, while Sarah Elliott added 12 with nine rebounds. Jennifer Humphrey collected 13 boards for the Wildcats, who managed 23 second-chance points.

Florida made the first run of the game, using a 7-0 spurt to take a 14-8 lead with just over 10 minutes remaining in the opening period. But Kentucky stormed back with a 17-3 spree with seven points from Samantha Mahoney to take a 25-17 advantage with 4:40 on the clock. Dalila Eshe hit two free throws and Sha Brooks hit a driving layin to get the Gators within four, but the Wildcats slowly built their lead back to eight, 31-23, with under two minutes left in the half. But Brooks, who led all scorers with 11 points in the opening half, got hot and provided two three-pointers to get UF within two, 31-29, to end the scoring.

Game 23: Florida 63, Mississippi State 48 February 9, 2006 • Starkville, Miss. • Humphrey Coliseum

Dalila Eshe scored 21 points with a career high 17 rebounds and Florida used a 19-6 run midway through the second half en route to a 63-48 victory over Mississippi State Thursday evening at Humphrey Coliseum.

The win was the third straight for the Gators, who improved to 18-5 overall, 6-4 in the Southeastern Conference while posting their first victory in Starkville since an 82-70 decision back on Jan. 4, 2001. The Lady Bulldogs lost their eighth consecutive game and fell to 6-17, 1-9 in the SEC.

"Dalila Eshe and Sarah Lowe did a great job of exhibiting senior leadership, especially in the second half," UF head coach Carolyn Peck said. "Dalila really took over inside and Sarah got us to execute our offense. We didn't execute very well in the first half. We had a lot of different lineups in the game and our execution wasn't as sharp as I would have liked it to be."

Along with her fourth double-double of the season, Eshe extended her consecutive made free throw streak to 37, hitting all five in the win. Sha Brooks (Jackson, Tenn.), the reigning SEC Freshman of the Week, contributed 11 points, while Marsha Dotson (Columbus, Ohio) sparked UF off the bench with 10 points and nine rebounds.

After shooting just 18.5 percent in the first half, Mississippi State came out and hit its first two shots of the second period to cut UF's lead to one, 24-23, with 18:50 remaining. Sha Brooks then canned a three-pointer from the left corner to start the Gators scoring, but Muiyorka Johnson put back an offensive rebound and UF called a timeout. The Gators responded by scoring the next two buckets, one from Marsha Dotson and an offensive put-back by Dalila Eshe, to extend the lead back to six, 31-25, with 15:29 remaining.

The teams traded scores for the next two minutes, with Brooks hitting a deep trey off an in-bounds play before Eshe sank two free throws and helped UF's lead grow to nine, 38-29, with 12:46 left.

MSU scored the next four points, cutting the lead to five, before Brittany Davis sank a 10-footer, Sarah Lowe connected on an outside jumper and then Eshe scored six straight points to spark a 14-4 run, as Florida took a 52-37 lead with just under six minutes left and never looked back.

The Gators shot just 34.7 percent (25-72) in the game, but the Lady Bulldogs managed just 29.5 percent (18-61) and committed 21 turnovers that UF converted into 21 points.

Muiyorka Johnson led MSU with 15 points and 12 rebounds, while Robin Porter tallied 12 points with 10 boards for the Bulldogs.

With the scored tied at 8-all, Florida used an 11-2 run over a 4:20 span thanks to six points off the bench from Marsha Dotson to begin to distance itself and take a 21-10 lead with just over nine minutes remaining in the first half. The Gators again held an 11-point advantage with 6:46 left in the period after Depree Bowden's driving layup, however those were the last points UF scored during the half. Mississippi State, which shot just 18.5 percent (5-27) and committed 11 turnovers during the first half, was unable to take advantage of UF's scoring drought, tallying just five points down the stretch, all from the free throw line, to cut the Gator lead to six points, 24-18, entering halftime.

Florida shot just 33.3 percent (11-33) from the floor and used a variety of different lineups in the first half, with Jessica Jackson and Kim Critton seeing extended playing time.

Game 24: South Carolina 81, Florida 63 February 12, 2006 • Gainesville, Fla. • O'Connell Center

Despite double-figure scoring efforts by seniors Sarah Lowe and Brittany Davis, the Florida women's basketball team fell to South Carolina in Southeastern Conference action 81-63 Sunday afternoon.

The Gators (18-6, 6-5 SEC) used a 15-3 run midway through the second half to take a 52-49 lead with 9:11 remaining. However, South Carolina (13-9, 4-6 SEC) outscored Florida 32-11 the rest of the way en route to a program-record third consecutive SEC road win. Head coach Carolyn Peck noted her team's lack of aggressiveness in the loss as a flaw against South Carolina.

"They were a very aggressive team and it was a very physical game," Peck said. "I didn't feel like we weren't responsive to that. We have to play a little stronger. Mentally we thought we were in it, but physically I don't think we were there as well as we should have been."

South Carolina outscored the Gators 40-30 in the paint and took advantage of 21 Florida turnovers to net 26 points. The Gamecocks also out-rebounded Florida 43-33 and made 51.7 percent of their shots from the field, compared to UF's 40.3 percent mark.

Davis led Florida with 12 points, including one shot from behind the three-point line, while grabbing six boards and with four assists. Lowe added 11 for the home team in her fourth double-figure scoring effort of the season, in addition to five rebounds, four steals and two assists. Freshman Marsha Dotson came off the bench for UF to chip in nine points on 4-of-6 shooting from the field.

Freshman Sha Brooks as well as seniors Dalila Eshe and Danielle Santos netted eight points apiece for Florida, as Brooks also had five steals. Santos added five rebounds and three assists, while Eshe chipped in four rebounds and one assist. She also extended her school-record free throws made streak to 39 before missing the front end of a one-and-one with 9:19 left in the game.

In the first half the Gators jumped out to a 7-2 lead by the 17:25 mark, but South Carolina fired back, tying up the score at 10-all as the clock ticked 14:26. The two teams traded baskets for the next several minutes of the game, which was tied up four times as the lead changed eight times in the first half. Brooks sank a three-pointer which broke up a 20-point lock with 8:10 remaining. After breaking tied up scores twice more, the Gators went to the locker room at the half down 35-31, the 12th time this season they've trailed at the break.

The Gamecocks forced Florida to play from behind for most of the second half, with the Gators holding the lead for just one minute and 17 seconds before USC began to take over with its game-deciding run.

Melanie Johnson paced South Carolina with a career-high 27 points and also grabbed 10 rebounds. Demetress Adams added 18 points with nine rebounds, while Lauren Simms tallied 14 points, including a pair of back-breaking three-pointers that gave the Gamecocks the lead for good after Lowe's jumper had cut the deficit to one, 55-5

Game 25: Florida 79, No. 2/3 LSU 78 (overtime) February 16, 2006 • Gainesville, Fla. • O'Connell Center

Senior Sarah Lowe hit two free throws with 3.2 seconds remaining in overtime to lift the University of Florida women's basketball team to a stunning 79-78 victory over No. 2/3 LSU Thursday evening at the O'Connell Center in front of 2,603 celebrating the team's final home game of the season. The win was the Gators' first ever over a top-4 ranked team, having defeated three No. 5-ranked teams prior to Thursday's victory. Florida's win also halted a six-game losing streak to LSU and snapped the Lady Tiger's 24-game Southeastern Conference win streak.

Also having a senior game to remember was forward Dalila Eshe, who scored eight of her 22 points in the overtime period, including a three-pointer over LSU's 6-foot-6 center Sylvia Fowles with 1:56 remaining that gave the Gators a 73-72 lead - their first lead of the entire game.

Fowles hit two free throws 12 seconds later and Florence Williams followed with a jumper that gave LSU (22-2, 10-1 SEC) a 76-73 lead with 29 seconds remaining. But Lowe countered and coolly nailed two free throws with 20 seconds on the clock to bring the Gators within one, 76-75. LSU's Erica White, a 91.7 percent free throw shooter, missed two straight from the charity stripe, but Fowles collected the second miss and put back an offensive board to extend the Tiger's lead to 78-75 with 14 seconds remaining.

But Lowe drove hard through up the middle of the lane and dropped in a layup and the Gators immediately fouled RaShonta LeBlanc, who missed both free throws. Gator freshman Marshae Dotson (Columbus, Ohio) collected the miss and Lowe drove again to the basket and was fouled by Seimone Augustus with three seconds left, setting up her heroics from the charity stripe.

"I knew I was going to make those free throws," Lowe said. "I never had a doubt in my mind. We shoot free throws every day and I felt relaxed and took myself back to the practice court."

Freshman Sha Brooks led the Gators with a career-high 25 points hitting 4-of-7 from the three-point arc and set a freshman record for treys in a season, passing the previous mark of 49 set by Talatha Bingham in 1996. She also collected five steals and five rebounds in 41 minutes of action.

Two seniors posted double figures, including Eshe who scored 22 points and grabbed five rebounds. Lowe tallied 17 and was a perfect 4-for-4 from the charity stripe. Senior Danielle Santos and Brittany Davis were plagued with foul trouble throughout the game, but managed to combine for six points and 10 rebounds. Santos was responsible for guarding LSU star Augustus in the later stages of the game and came through, as Augustus managed just two points in overtime.

Brooks had a strong night all around, scoring a career-high 25 points and exceeded the Florida record of 49 three-pointers hit by a freshman. She made four on Thursday night, including one from near half court with 4:48 left in the second half to narrow the margin to 65-59 and stat a 9-0 run.

The seniors added the run with a 6-0 effort as Eshe scored back-to-back buckets to pull the Gators within two points (9-0 run), and Lowe sank a jumper to tie the game 65-65 and force the game into overtime.

LSU's Seimone Augustus scored a career-high 35 points, and Sylvia Fowles added 23 points and 16 rebounds, but the Tigers committed 22 turnovers.

Game 26: Auburn 73, Florida 58 February 19, 2006 • Auburn, Ala. • Beard-Eaves Memorial Coliseum

Dalila Eshe tied her career-high of 25 points and freshman Sha Brooks added 18, but it wasn't enough as Florida lost at Auburn, 73-58 at Beard-Eaves Memorial Coliseum Sunday afternoon.

The Gators (19-7, 7-6 SEC), who were coming off Thursday's stunning upset of No. 2 LSU, shot just 35.5 percent (22-62) from the floor and never seemed in sync against the taller Tigers (13-12, 4-8), who hit 49.1 percent (28-57), scored 38 points in the paint and held a 40-35 rebounding advantage.

"We did not do a good job of defending the paint and we knew that Auburn was going to pound the ball inside to KeKe Carrier," UF head coach Carolyn Peck said. "Nitasha Brown also got hot and it was senior night here and she stepped up - we know what that's like."

DeWanna Bonner led Auburn with 16 points and 10 rebounds, while senior Marita Payne added 14 points, Brown tallied 11 and Whitney Boddie rebounded from a two-game suspension to score 10 off the bench. Carrier, a 6-foot-7 center, recorded all of her eight points in the first half to match her eight rebounds.

Eshe and Brooks were the only double-figure scorers for Florida, who had its three-game winning streak against Auburn snapped.

"Dalila and Sha stepped up offensively, but we usually have to have three players clicking," Peck said. "We just didn't have that today. Danielle (Santos) couldn't get her shot to fall and Brittany (Davis) couldn't finish inside. We only had 13 turnovers, but to me it seemed like a million because they were bad ones that came at crucial times and that had a lot to do with the outcome."

With Auburn holding a 43-31 lead, Eshe nailed a three-pointer and Marshae Dotson followed with a three-point play as the Gators closed the gap to six points, 43-35, with 14:35 remaining. But Brown nailed a deep three-pointer that seemed to quell the Gator's spirit and ignite Auburn, as her trey strated a 17-6 spree and the Tigers built a 60-43 lead with 6:20 left. Florida staged a furious rally, cutting Auburn's lead to eight points, 64-56, behind a 10-2 run, but couldn't overcome the large deficit, as the Tigers made their free throws down the stretch to hold on for the win and snap their four-game losing streak.

The Tigers roared out of the gate, jumping out to a 5-0 lead, while the Gators missed their first four shots. Florida tied the game with a trey and a jumper from Dalila Eshe, but Auburn scored the next five points. The Gators continued to whittle the deficit between three and five points over the ensuing 10 minutes until Joanna Clayden canned a three-pointer and extended Auburn's lead to seven points with 5:30 remaining the half. Eshe countered with a three-point play, but Alexis Ogubie and Whitney Boddie hit back-to-back buckets and the Tigers took an eight-point advantage, 29-21, with just over three and half minutes left before the break.

Turnovers and cold shooting continued to plague the Gators, who hit just one field goal in the final 5:15 of the first half and found themselves trailing at the break for the 14th time this season, 36-25.

Florida struggled with its shot in the first half, hitting just 36.0 percent (9-25), while committing eight turnovers. Eshe accounted for 14 of the Gators' 25 points, hitting 6-of-10 from the floor and provided UF's lone field goal in the final 5:15 of the opening stanza.

Game 27: Florida 95, No. 5 Tennessee 93 (overtime) February 26, 2006 • Knoxville, Tenn. • Thompson-Boling Arena

Brittany Davis scored a career-high 29 points in leading a balanced offensive attack that produced a stunning 95-93 overtime victory against No. 5 Tennessee in Thompson-Boling Arena.

Freshman Sha Brooks played 40 minutes and equaled her career-high with 25 points, while seniors Sarah Lowe, Dalila Eshe and Danielle Santos accounted for the rest of Florida's scoring. Lowe tallied 15 points along with a season-high seven rebounds, a career-tying six steals and six assists with two turnovers while playing all 45 minutes. Eshe hit for 13 points with four steals in 40 minutes, while Santos tallied 13 points, five rebounds, four steals and three assists in 38 minutes.

The Gators snapped a 12-game losing streak against the Lady Vols and collected its first win ever on Tennessee's home court in 16 tries did so in front of 20,790 fans (turnstile 17,595), the largest crowd ever to watch the Gators play.

Davis scored six of her 29 points in the overtime frame, while Lowe added three points and Brooks tallied four, including two free throws with 10.2 seconds remaining to give the Gators a four-point lead. Florida's defense forced UT into a season-high 28 turnovers, which the Gators converted into 30 points. UF also collected a season-high 20 steals and shot a steady 25-of-32 from the free throw line, including 4-of-8 in overtime. UT superior height advantage helped the Lady Vols to a 54-38 rebounding difference, but Florida held its own in the paint where UT outscored the Gators just 40-34. UF shot 39.5 percent (32-81) in the game, but hit 48.6 percent (16-33) in the second half and 57.1 percent (4-7) in overtime. UT canned 48.6 percent overall.

Davis scored the first points in overtime, but the Gators turned the ball over on their next two offensive possessions and UT took advantage, as Candace Parker scored the next five points of the game to give UT an 87-84 lead with three minutes remaining. Davis countered with a three-point from the left side of the arc to even the score. On UF's next possession, she went to the free throw line where she hit one of two to swing the lead back to UF, 88-87. Sha Brooks then hit a short jumper and Lowe sank a driving layup to give UF a 92-87 advantage with 1:12 remaining.

Zolman answered with two free throws and Parker added one, as UT closed within two, 92-90, with 56 seconds left. Lowe then hit one free throw and lifted the Gators to a three-point advantage, 93-90. UF's defensive star Santos fouled out with 28 seconds left, as Alex Fuller went to the line and made one. Lowe collected the miss and drove to UF's end of the floor and dribbled around forcing the Vols to foul Brooks, who coolly dropped in two from the free throw line and gave the Gators a 95-91 lead with 10.2 seconds remaining. Ty'sha Fluker powered up an inside jumper to get the Vols within two, 95-93. UT sent Brooks to the free throw line with 1.1 seconds. She missed both attempts, but the Vols were unable to get off a shot as the Gators pulled off the upset.

Florida scored the first four points of the second half to tie the game at 34-34, but Fluker canned two straight inside hoops to give UT the lead. Florida chipped away, never giving in and after falling behind 48-43 with 14:48 left, the Gators ripped off 18-2 run to take a 61-50 lead with 10:45 remaining. Brooks came alive during the stretch, scoring eight points.

After the teams traded buckets, the Vols road the wave of a raucous crowd and stormed back with a 12-2 run that cut UF's lead to one, 65-64, with 6:44 left in the game. UF however, refused to relinquish the lead, as Santos calmly hit two free throws, as UF answered UT's buckets on consecutive trips before Eshe converted a three-point play to take a 72-68 lead with 4:47 left. The Vols countered with a 4-1 run and again got within one, 73-72, with 3:04 on the clock, before Davis hit a tough inside jumper and again the teams began to traded buckets and free throws.

After two more free throw from Parker, the Gators seemed a little out of sync in their next offensive possession. But Davis nailed an eight-footer in traffic and gave the Gators a 79-76 lead with 1:09 remaining. UT had several shots on its trip down the floor, but missed all of them and fouled Eshe, who finally collected a miss. Eshe canned two free throws with 34 seconds remaining, before Zolman hit a deep three-pointer with 22.0 seconds on the clock to narrow UF's lead to two, 81-79.

UF in-bounded the ball and UT fouled Lowe with 15.6 seconds remaining. Lowe missed the first, but hit the second to extend the Gator lead to three, 82-79, as UT called its final timeout. The Lady Vols worked the ball to Zolman, who responded by nailed a 3-pointer with 8.4 seconds left to tie the game. Brooks got off a shot in the final second, but it bounced off the rim and the game headed into overtime.

Game 28: No. 23/iv Florida 98, Mississippi State 83 March 2, 2006 • North Little Rock, Ark. • ALLETL Arena • SEC Tournament First Round

Danielle Santos scored a career-high 24 points leading the 23rd-ranked University of Florida women's basketball team to a 98-83 victory over Mississippi State in the first round of the Southeastern Conference Tournament at ALLETL Arena.

The victory snapped a six-game losing streak in the SEC Tournament for the fifth-seeded Gators (21-7), who handed the 12-seeded Lady Bulldogs (6-22) their 13th consecutive loss.

Gator freshman Sha Brooks scored 18 of her 22 points in the second half, reaching the 20-point mark for the third time in the last four games. Brittany Davis added 18 points with nine rebounds, while Dalila Eshe tallied 15 with six boards. Florida also received eight points and seven assists from Sarah Lowe and six points and six rebounds from Marshae Dotson.

Florida did not hit a field goal in the final 6:32 of the game, netting their last 17 points from the free throw line, as MSU never relinquished its comeback effort, fouling the Gators on every possession. Florida finished the game hitting 92.6 percent (25-27) from the free throw, a Gator percentage record in SEC Tournament games. The 98 points also set a team record, passing the 96 points UF scored in its first round win against Arkansas in the 2000 event, also the last time the Gators won a tournament game.

The Gators roared out of the halftime locker room using a smothering full-court press and scoring the first 10 points of the period in the opening two and a half minutes to take a 57-39 lead. But MSU stormed right back with an 11-2 run, cutting UF's lead to nine points, 59-50, with 14:13 remaining. Santos hit two free throws, but Miyorka Johnson answered with a bucket for UF to keep UF's lead in single digits before Lowe picked up a loose ball and knocked down a trey before Brooks added a short jumper and the Gator lead grew to 14 with 10:12 left. Lauren Roberts followed with a three-point play, as Lowe collected her third personal foul. But Santos continued to hit big shots and canned her first of consecutive three-pointers between two MSU free throws for her 23rd point of the night, tying her career high. After two more MSU free throws, Brooks nailed back-to-back treys to cap a 17-5 run that gave the Gators a 78-59 lead with 7:23 remaining. MSU never let down, chipping away at the deficit, eventually getting within nine, 87-78, with 1:58 remaining and holding Florida without a field goal for the final 6:32 of the game. The Gators came through from the free throw line during that span, scoring their final 17 points from the charity stripe by hitting 17-of-18.

The game was even for the first three minutes of the game before MSU went on a 9-2 run to take a 15-8 lead. The Gators responded with a three-pointer from Lowe that began a 10-2 march for Florida which took an 18-17 lead after Davis put back an offensive rebound with 12:12 left in the half. The lead then changed hands on the next three possessions before Dotson's six foot turn-around jumper in the paint ended the trend and put UF up by three, 24-21. After an MSU bucket, Davis converted a three-point play, but the Lady Bulldogs answered with a trey from Robin Porter and closed to within one, 27-26.

The Gators countered with a two straight jumpers from Santos

Game 29: Kentucky 88, No. 23/rv Florida 70 March 3, 2006 • North Little Rock, Ark. • ALLETEL Arena • SEC Tournament Quarterfinal Sha Brooks (Jackson, Tenn.) scored a game-high 22 points, but it wasn't enough as the Gators lost to Kentucky 88-70 in the quarterfinals of the Southeastern Conference Tournament Friday evening at ALLETEL Arena.

Fifth-seeded Florida (21-8) shot just 32 percent (24-75) from the floor during the game, including a 2-of-18 effort from the three-point arc, while fourth-seeded Kentucky (21-7) pounded the ball inside to score 40 points in the paint and hit 56.7 percent (34-60) during the game, including a 60 percent clip in the second half.

"Obviously, we're very disappointed because we thought we really had a chance to go further here," UF head coach Carolyn Peck said. "Kentucky did a good job coming at us and took advantage of a little fatigue on our part. I am proud of what our team has accomplished, but we certainly are not satisfied."

Brooks' 22 points marked the fourth time in the last five games the rookie has scored at least 22 points. UF's Sarah Lowe (Wynnewood, Pa.) scored 10 points with three assists and three steals, while Danielle Santos (Marietta, Ga.) added 11 points and seven rebounds. Brittany Davis (Gainesville) collected a game-high 12 rebounds along with seven points, hitting just 1-of-13 shots and Dalila Eshe (Tallahassee) tallied nine points on 3-of-10 shooting.

Kentucky continued its torrid shooting to begin the second half, roaring out with an 8-2 lead to extend its lead to 16 points, 52-36, with 17:14 remaining. Florida slowly chipped away at the deficit and got within 10 points, 61-51, after Sha Brooks connected on the Gators first three-pointer of the game with 12:20 on the clock.

After one Kentucky free throw, Brooks nailed another trey and brought UF within eight, 63-55 with 10:50 left in the game. Carly Ormerod responded for the Wildcats with a driving bucket that sparked a mini 5-0 run as Kentucky's lead grew to 13 points, 68-55. The Gators again whittled down the deficit, scoring the game's next five points from the free throw line and reduced UK's lead to single digits, 68-60, with 8:10 remaining. Jennifer Humphrey hit one from the charity stripe before Natassia Alcius hit a trey from the top of the key and UK again jumped out to a 12-point lead, 72-60, with 6:21 left in the game.

The teams traded buckets for the next three-plus minutes, as the taller Wildcats pounded the paint in answering every UF shot. The Gators eventually were forced to foul and UK hit 10-of-14 from the free throw line down the stretch to extend the final margin.

Sarah Elliott and Samantha Mahoney each scored 20 points for Kentucky, while Natassia added 13 points, six from the free throw line, and Jennifer Humphrey collected 10 rebounds for the Wildcats, which held a 42-39 rebounding edge and shot 8-of-15 from the three-point arc.

The first six minutes of the game were played evenly, with the Gators holding a slight 17-14 lead with 12:10 remaining. That's when Kentucky's Jenny Pfeiffer started heating up her three-point shot, canning two to ignite a quick 8-0 run, as the Wildcats took a 22-17 lead with just under 10 minutes to go. Scoring from Sarah Lowe, Brittany Davis and Depre Bowden shrank the deficit to two, 24-22 with 7:05 left in the period before the Wildcats continued their hot perimeter shooting by using a 9-0 spree to take a 33-22 advantage with five minutes remaining.

Marshae Dotson came off the bench and scored the next four points of the game, dropping the lead to seven, before Samantha Mahoney nailed UK's sixth trey of the half to quell a bigger Gator run. After Lowe hit two technical foul free throws called against Jennifer Humphrey, Mahoney hit two more buckets, the second an offensive put-back that extended the Wildcat lead to 12, 40-28, with 2:10 remaining. The teams traded buckets for the rest of the half, as the Gators headed into the locker room trailing 44-34.

Game 30: No. 24 New Mexico 83, Florida 59 March 18, 2006 • Tucson, Ariz. • McKale Center • NCAA First Round Florida lost to New Mexico 83-59 in the first round of the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship held at the McKale Center.

The sixth-seeded Gators (21-9) trailed 11-10 with 15:19 remaining in the first half when the 11th-seeded Lobos (22-9), ranked 24th, exploded on a devastating 31-6 run to take a commanding 42-16 lead with 3:26 left in the period en route to a 48-24 halftime score and Florida would never recover.

The teams each scored 35 points in the second half, but the 24-point halftime deficit was too much for Florida to overcome.

"We didn't have the same sense of urgency that we had in the second half," UF head coach Carolyn Peck said. "I think the first half we dug ourselves a big hole. If we could start the game the way we started the second half, maybe we would have had a different outcome."

Florida actually attempted nine more shots than New Mexico, but its shot wouldn't fall as easily as the Lobo's, who hit 50.9 percent in the game, including a 56.7 percent clip in the decisive first half. The Gators hit 33.9 percent from the floor overall and just 28.6 percent in the first 20 minutes. Both teams connected on six three-pointers, but the main scoring difference came at the free throw line, where UNM converted 23-of-28 compared to UF's 11-of-16.

Senior Dalila Eshe led the Gators on Saturday with 17 points and seven rebounds, while Danielle Santos added 15 points, six rebounds and four steals.

The loss ends the collegiate careers of UF's four seniors Brittany Davis, Dalila Eshe, Sarah Lowe and Danielle Santos. The quartet combined to play in 454 games with 280 starting assignments while totaling 11,124 minutes. Additionally, during their careers the foursome scored 3,147 points and collected 1,902 rebounds.
