Depree Bowden is a quick, athletic guard who can play any spot on the perimeter ... excellent court vision ... according to strength and conditioning coach Karin Werth had the most improvement on the team in her strength and conditioning during the 2005 summer ... also completed classes during the 2005 Summer B session ... high school teammate of current Gator junior Briana Phillips ... named to the 2006 Southeastern Conference Academic Honor Roll and the 2005 SEC Freshman Academic Honor Roll.

Sophomore Year (2005-06)

Appeared in all 30 games, starting the first three of the year ... scored in 21 games and totaling 111 points ... contributed seven points against Auburn (Feb. 2), hitting 3-of-3 from the floor with one free throw, sparking the Gators in the win by scoring four points in the final two minutes of the first half after the Tigers closed within one point ... played a valuable 16 minutes during the Jan. 22 win over No. 19 Vanderbilt ... sprained her right ankle during the Jan. 19 game at Ole Miss and played just two minutes as a result ... career game in the comeback win against Florida State (Jan. 2), scoring 13 of her career-high 15 points in the second half, while collecting four rebounds and four steals ... sparked UF's 16-point second-half comeback at Charlotte (Nov. 30), collecting a career-high four steals all in the second half along with four points and six rebounds ... grabbed a career-high nine rebounds Nov. 27 vs. Stetson ... scored a then-career-high 13 points in the season-opener against St. Francis (NY).

Freshman Year (2004-05)

Appeared in 27 of UF's 29 games while averaging 7.4 minutes per outing ... scored in 13 games, netting a season-high eight points on 4-of-6 shooting against Delaware State (Dec. 6) ... totaled 49 points and 33 rebounds ... played a season-long 17 minutes in the victory over Temple (Dec. 4), scoring five points with three rebounds ... played an SEC-long 12 minutes at LSU (Feb. 27), when she canned a pair of free throws, while collecting two rebounds and two assists ... hit 11-of-14 free throws for a 78.6 percentage ... canned a three-pointer at Alabama (Feb. 6) to score her first points in an SEC game ... did not travel with the team to its January 30 game at Vanderbilt due to strep throat and did not play in UF's ensuing game versus Tennessee ... during UF's first win of the season (vs. Akron, Nov. 27), scored her first collegiate points, putting back an offensive rebound with 17:03 remaining in the game ... her performance versus Akron was her most complete game of the season, putting up nine points, five rebounds, three assists, three steals and one block in 15 minutes of play ... cited by Coach Carolyn Peck for jump-starting the defense on numerous occasions, stating after the Akron game, "We really picked up our defensive pressure and again Depree Bowden had a lot to do with our run."

Graduated in June of 2004 from Bradenton Southeast High School, where she was coached by John Harder ... a two-year captain and four-year starter for the Seminoles ... completed her career netting a school-record 1,919 points along with 976 rebounds and 477 assists ... produced the best four-year record in program history, 118-14, by any Southeast girls basketball player, winning four district championships, two region titles and advancing to the final four twice ... Class 4A state runner-up her junior season, while helping the team to the semifinals in 2004 and the Elite 8 her first two years ... team was 58-8 her final two seasons ... her senior year she averaged 15.5 points, 7.7 rebounds and 5.0 assists, helping Southeast to a 27-4 record ... averaged 14.6 points, 6 rebounds and 6.4 assists per game her junior season, when she guided Southeast to the state Class 4A championship game ... *Herald-Tribune* named her their 2004 Female Player of the Year ... 2003 and 2004 Florida Sports Writers Association 4A All-State First Team selection, as well as a three-time Street & Smith All-America Honorable Mention honoree ... recognized as a 2001 adidas Top Ten Camp, an adidas Top Ten Camp Upperclass All-Star and a 4A All-State honorable mention selection in 2001 and 2002 ... also an accomplished volleyball player, Bowden broke Southeast's record for kills, previously held by current Gator teammate Briana Phillips (614).

Second Team All-SEC, as selected by the league's coaches and media ... voted to the All-SEC Freshmen Team ... played in all 30 games, starting 29 games and scoring in 29 ... UF's second leading scorer (13.7 ppg) ... led Gators with 65 steals and 61 three-pointers, hitting at least one in 24 games ... scored at least 22 points in four of the last six games, tying her career-high of 25 twice (LSU & Tennessee) ... ended the season hitting at least one three-pointer in 11 consecutive games ... in the SEC (all games), ranked No. 9 in scoring, No. 12 in free throw percentage, No. 4 in three-pointers made, No. 14 for 3-point field goal percentage and No. 5 in steals ... honored four times as SEC Freshman of the Week, last for the span of Feb. 20-26, when she matched her career-high of 25 points in the upset at No. 5 Tennessee (Feb. 26), hitting two free throws with 10.2 seconds remaining in overtime to give the Gators a four-point lead ... her third of four three-pointers against LSU (Feb. 16), broke UF's freshman record of 49 treys set by Talatha Bingham in 1996 ... UF's leading scorer nine times: St. Francis (13 points), Seton Hall (18), Stetson (19), FAMU (21), Liberty (22), Auburn (16), Kentucky (21), LSU (25) and Kentucky (22) ... led the Gators with a career-high 25 points in the upset win over No. 2 LSU (Feb. 16), when she also collected five steals ... exploded for a game-high 21 points in the win at No. 21 Kentucky (Feb. 5), including a pivotal three-point play with 1:21 remaining ... scored in the first 15 games of her career but was shutout against Kentucky (Jan. 12), shooting 0-4 from the floor in 15 minutes ... hit 17 consecutive free throws (spanning the games against Rhode Island and Liberty), ending the streak against Liberty but still hitting 11-of-12 that game ... scored 10 of her 11 points in the final 4:23 of the game against Rhode Island, as she hit two free throws to push UF's advantage back to nine at 65-56 with 3:54 left ... three times tied UF's freshmen record with five three-pointers in a game (Nov. 27 vs. Stetson, Dec. 21 vs. FAMU & Feb. 2 vs. Auburn) ... scored 17 of UF's first 22 points versus Stetson, on 5-of-5 shooting from behind the arc, finishing with a game-high 19 points while hitting 5-of-7 from deep along with five assists ... received the starting nod at the point guard spot for the season-opening game against St. Francis, replacing senior Sarah Lowe, who was interviewing for the Rhodes Scholarship, becoming the first true freshman to start a season-opener since Lowe and senior Brittany Davis earned starts in the initial game of the 2002-03 campaign ... led a balanced scoring attack in both wins during the season-opening Seton Hall Basketball Classic, netting 13 against St. Francis (NY) in her collegiate debut, before recording 18 points with seven steals in 40 minutes of action against Seton Hall.

Started all 30 games, scoring in each ... UF's third-leading scorer (12.0) and tied as the top rebounder (7.1) ... earned second team ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District honors ... in SEC all games stats ranked No. 15 for scoring and No. 8 for rebounding ... reached the 800-point milestone for her career during the SEC Tournament quarterfinal game against Kentucky (March 3) ... scored in double-figures in 21 games, most recently 18 points against Mississippi State (March 2) in the first round of the SEC Tournament ... exploded for a career-high 29 points with nine rebounds in the stunning win at No. 5 Tennessee (Feb. 26) ... during win at No. 5 Tennessee (Feb. 26) collected her 500th career rebound and her 750th career point ... tallied her fifth career double-double, helping UF upset No. 21 Kentucky (Feb. 5) with 12 points and 13 rebounds ... compiled a then-team-best streak of 22 consecutive made free throws, but had the run snapped during the January 19 game at Ole Miss when she missed two straight from the charity stripe. UF's leading game scorer eight times, most recently against at Tennessee (Feb. 26) when she tallied a career-high 29 points ... scored in double-figures in 13 consecutive games midway through the year ... one of two Gators who scored in every game (Dalila Eshe) ... fourth career double-double (16 points & 11 rebounds) helped UF rally against Florida State (Jan. 2) ... led UF with 17 points and 11 rebounds versus Rhode Island (Dec. 29) - her third career double-double ... recorded second career double-double with 12 points and 14 rebounds versus Illinois (Dec. 9) also collecting a career-high five steals ... her career-best fifth steal against Illinois came with 15 seconds remaining, as UF held a three-point lead ... career night at Charlotte on Nov. 30 with 23 points and 16 rebounds, with 10 of those boards offensive, collecting her first career double-double ... played on the perimeter during a few sets each game this season ... named SEC Player of the Week (Dec. 5-11), helping UF collect wins over South Alabama and Illinois and averaging 16.0 points and 9.0 rebounds while hitting 73.7 percent of her shots, that included 2-of-3 from the three-point arc. 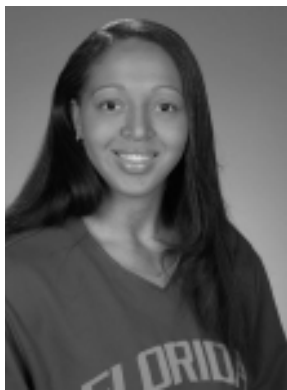
