Exhibition Game 1: Team adidas/Premier Players 82, Florida 66

Nov. 5, 2006 * Gainesville, Fla. * Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Sha Brooks led Florida with a game-high 22 points and four assists, but it wasn't enough to fend off a 82-66 exhibition loss to Team adidas/Premier Players Sunday afternoon at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

"We're very young and shy two point guards right now, but I was still disappointed with today's output, because we have looked much better in practice," UF head coach Carolyn Peck said. "We need to box-out better, and in the Southeastern Conference, you'll suffer if you aren't boxing out. We also had too many turnovers, and we need to find a way to stop making these mistakes."

Florida, which has just two players taller than 6-feet, was out-rebounded 62-46, giving up 29 on the offensive end. The young Gators also committed 22 turnovers, but forced 23 from the visiting squad, which shot 47.2 percent in the second half and 39.5 percent in the game. Florida hit 36.2 percent from the floor, including a 3-for-14 effort beyond the extended experimental three-point arc.

Despite trailing Premier Players 7-3 after three minutes of play in the opening half, the Gators responded with a 5-0 run for their first lead of the game. After knotting the score at 11-all, the Orange and Blue's Kim Critton and Briana Phillips recorded a pair of baskets for the four-point lead. Premier Players answered back with a 8-4 run to tie the game at 19 before Kim Dye notched Florida's first three-pointer of the game for the 22-19 lead. Led by Sherelle Sowho's 11 points, Premier Players closed the half with a 20-14 rally, in which the Gators trailed by 37-31 at the two-minute mark. Marsha Dotson tallied a pair from the charity stripe to bring the Gators within four at the 1:17 mark, but it wasn't enough to stifle off a 42-33 halftime deficit.

Jessica Jackson led the Gators with seven points and one block in the first period, while junior Depree Bowden pulled down five boards.

The two teams fought closely and traded points in the opening minutes of the second half before Premier Players climbed to a 53-39 lead with 15 minutes remaining to play. The teams continued to trade baskets until Dotson snapped the 14-point Premier Players lead with a layup on a fast-break, and the Gators continued to climb the scoreboard and found themselves within 10 at the 10-minute mark. Despite the late rally, Florida found itself trailing 70-55 with six minutes to play. Premier Players posted a 12-11 final run en route to the 82-66 victory.

Bowden posted a team-high nine rebounds for the Gators and four assists, while Critton and Jackson each tallied nine points and Dotson and Phillips chipped in eight points each.

Game 1: Florida 78, North Florida 37

Nov. 10, 2006 * Gainesville, Fla. * Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Florida (1-0) opened the 2006-07 season with a dominating 78-37 victory over instate opponent North Florida (0-1) Friday evening at the O'Connell Center.

With its fourth-largest opening day victory of 41 points, Florida improved its all-time opening day record to 18-15 and 4-1 under head coach Carolyn Peck, while snapping North Florida's streak of 13-straight opening-day wins.

All 11 Gators scored, with four reaching double figures, including Kim Dye, who collected a game-high 13 points with four 3-pointers. Junior Depree Bowden chipped in 11 points, while senior Briana Phillips and freshman LaKendra Phillips each added 10. Eleven Florida players saw action in the victory, and each contributed in Florida's first 40+ point margin of victory since defeating Lamar, 91-42, on Nov. 22, 2002 - also Carolyn Peck's first game on the Gator sideline.

"We played all of our players tonight and all of them scored. As a coach, you can't ask for much more than that. Every single one of them answered when called upon, and that's going to be a key in our success throughout the season," Peck said.

Despite being out-rebounded by North Florida 22-16 in the opening half, Florida came back and recorded 25 rebounds in the second half to lead the category 41-38. The Gators also led in assists (13-6) and blocks (5-0), and forced 30 Lady Ospreys turnovers, including 17 in the first half.

The two teams traded points during the opening minutes of the second half before the Gators posted 15 unanswered points en route to a 60-28 lead with 10 minutes to play. After the Lady Osprey's Tiffany Williams notched five points on a three-pointer and a layup, the Gators came back with a 13-0 run before the game ended at 78-37.

Florida climbed to a 37-17 halftime lead as Dye and Bowden combined for nearly half of the Gators' points. Dye notched nine of her 10 points from the arc, while Bowden's eight points were a result of 3-for-4 shooting. Marsha Dotson grabbed a team-high 10 boards along with seven points, while Briana Phillips collected four boards, helping Florida earn a 41-38 rebounding edge.

The Lady Ospreys claimed their lone lead of the game in the opening minutes on a three-pointer by Tamara Hubbard, before Dotson tied the game with a layup and free throw. Two of Dye's three-pointers came within the first three minutes of the half and sprung the Gators to a 9-3 lead. The Orange and Blue capitalized on an 11-0 run midway through the period for a 27-8 lead with eight minutes remaining to play, but the Lady Ospreys countered with nine points to the Gators 10 in the final minutes to close the half at 37-17.

Overall, Florida out-shot North Florida 45.2 percent to 25.0 percent, and was 16-of-23 from the charity stripe for a near 70 percent average, while North Florida was just 5-for-16.

Game 2: #rv/rv Xavier 86, #rv/rv Florida 70 Nov. 12, 2006 * Cincinnati, Ohio * Cintas Center

Marshae Dotson scored 14 of her game-high 20 points in the second half, but it wasn't enough to lead Florida's furious second-half charge against Xavier (1-0), falling 86-70, in the Cintas Center Sunday evening.

The Gators (1-1) cut a 21-point halftime deficit to nine points, 58-49, with 14:12 remaining in the game after opening the second period with a 22-11 run. Sha Brooks, who finished with 13 points, began the final stanza with a three-pointer, but the XU's Santana Granderson answered with one from long range. Dotson then tallied a three-point play and Briana Phillips followed with a power lay-in to spark the Gator momentum which eventually cut the deficit to single-digits.

Xavier countered immediately with a 9-0 run and the hole ballooned back to 18 points, 67-49 with less than 12 minutes left in the game. The teams then traded buckets and Florida couldn't get any closer until mounting one final run that closed the spread to 12 points, 80-68, with just over three minutes remaining and the Gators just couldn't catch up.

"A lot of what happened tonight had to do with our inexperience," said UF head coach Carolyn Peck of the young Gators whose roster features nine freshmen and sophomores with just three upperclassmen. "We didn't really settle into their defense until the second half. They played a great defensive game. One thing tonight's game did was expose a weakness, which was our rotations on defense. We'll go back to Gainesville and focus on that."

Florida outscored Xavier 45-39 in the second half, when the Gators shot an improved 40.6 percent (13-32) from the field, out-rebounded the Muskateers, 24-19, and turned the ball over just six times.

Along with her career-high 20-point total, Dotson collected five rebounds, while Briana Phillips snared a team-high eight boards. Junior Depree Bowden joined Dotson and Brooks in double-figures, recording 13 points along with five rebounds and four steals.

Florida's aggressiveness in the second half translated in an increase in trips to the free throw line, where the Gators converted 24-of-32 for a 75-percent effort.

Granderson's 19 points led five Muskateers in double-figures, as the hosts shot a steady 45.6 percent (31-68) from the floor on the night and earned a 45-37 rebounding advantage, while forcing the Gators into 20 miscues.

Dotson from neighboring Columbus, Ohio, got the game off on the right foot for the Gators, banking in a running 8-footer. However, the hosting Muskateers roared back with a 15-2 run just under seven minutes into the game. Kim Critton ended the run with a pair of free throws and the teams exchanged buckets before Xavier ripped off an 8-1 run and held a 27-9 advantage with less than eight minutes remaining in the opening half.

Florida women's basketball team dropped an 88-60 decision to No. 18 California Friday evening in the first round of the Timeout for HIV/AIDS Classic at Pepperdine University held at Firestone Fieldhouse.

Marshae Dotson led Florida with 14 points and five rebounds, shooting 5-of-9 from the floor, while Sha Brooks added 11 points and four rebounds for the Gators, who shot just 32.3 percent (20-62) from the floor during the game and were out-rebounding 46-25 by the taller Golden Bears (2-0), who shot 64.9 percent from the floor during the game, including a 72.4 percent clip in the decisive first half when Cal took a 48-27 lead. UF's defense did force 24 turnovers, while committing just 14.

Freshman Jennifer Mossor was solid in her Gator debut, scoring eight points in 17 minutes of action. Mossor missed UF's first two games with a stress fracture. Devane Hampton led five Bears in double-figures scoring, netting 19 points and nine rebounds off the bench.

Florida opened the second half scoring the first three points to reduce the deficit to 18 points, 48-30, Cal responded with a three-pointer and never trailed by less than 20 for the rest of the game.

The first half belonged to the Cal Bears, who shot a sizzling 72.4 percent (21-29) in the first half and dominated the boards, 22-7. Marshae Dotson and Kim Dye helped the Gators to an early 5-2 lead, but Cal used scoring from four different players to take a 10-5 advantage with 14:09 remaining.

Sha Brooks got in the scorebook with a deep three-pointer before the teams exchanged buckets, as UF trailed just three, 12-10, with 12:45 left in the period. That's when Cal exploded on a devastating 28-6 run and assumed a 40-16 lead with just under five minutes remaining in the half.

Florida out-scored the Bears 11-8 the rest of the half, but took a 48-27 deficit into the locker room. The Gators hit 36.7 percent (11-30) of their shots in the opening period, with Dotson and Brooks accounting for eight apiece.

Sha Brooks scored a season-high 24 points and Depree Bowden added a career-high 18, but No. 14/12 Rutgers spoiled their outstanding offensive efforts as the Scarlet Knights topped Florida, 88-71, Saturday evening in the consolation game of the Timeout for HIV/AIDS Classic at Pepperdine University.

Rutgers (1-2) used a key 12-0 run midway through the second half to break open a close game and hand the Gators (1-3) their third straight loss. Florida held a 40-37 halftime lead, but the Knights opened the final stanza with a 16-5 spree to take a 53-45 advantage. The Gators continued to fight and got scoring that included a three-pointer from Jennifer Mossor, who helped UF close within five, 55-50, at the 14:12 mark. That's when Rutgers exploded on a devastating 12-0 run that last less than two minutes, as the Gator deficit moved to 18 points, 68-50, with 11:51 remaining and Florida just couldn't recover.

"In the first half we were very aggressive and played well," UF head coach Carolyn Peck said. "We didn't hesitate on our shots and took what the defense gave us. We just didn't do that in the second half and that was the difference."

Brooks, who earned a spot on the All-Tournament team, finished the night one point off her career-high scoring mark, as she went 6-of-10 from the three-point arc. Bowden had a break-out two-game spell, hitting 6-of-10 from the floor and 6-of-6 from the free throw line while recording eight rebounds against Rutgers.

Florida showed great improvement in its rebounding efforts, as Rutgers held just a 32-30 advantage during the game.

Epiphany Prince tallied a game-high 29 points with eight assists to lead Rutgers to its first win of the season. Brittany Ray added 20 points, while Kia Vaughn recorded 17 points and 10 rebounds for the Knights, which shot 58.6 percent from the floor during the game, including a 66.7 percent mark in the deciding second half.

The teams exchanged buckets during the opening four minutes of the game, when Florida turned up its defensive intensity. Down two at the 15:58 mark of the first half, Depree Bowden collected back-to-back steals and went the length of the court on both to spark an 11-3 run over a five-minute span giving the Gators a 16-10 lead with 10:38 remaining.

The teams traded scores for the next few minutes until Rutgers went on a 7-0 run to retake the lead, 22-21, with seven minutes left in the period. After another scoring exchange, Bullard nailed a three-point to spark a long-range shooting barrage for the Gators, as Brooks buried three consecutive treys and gave Florida a 35-38 lead and held on to take the 40-37 advantage into the locker room.

Senior Kim Dye matched her season-high of 14 points Tuesday evening as Florida defeated IUPUI, 71-57, at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

Along with Dye, sophomores Jessica Jackson and Marsha Dotson also scored in double figures with 13 and 12 points, respectively. Jackson's point total marked a career high, and her eight rebounds also were a personal best.

The victory was the Gators' 13th consecutive home win against non-conference opponents, while snapping a three-game slide.

"I thought we showed spurts of improvement today, and I think two important elements of improvement that we saw was in Kim (Dye) and Jessica (Jackson)," UF head coach Carolyn Peck said. "Kim was very offensive minded for us today, and Jessica played well in the post and has shown improvement every day."

Florida and IUPUI traded points in the opening minutes of the second half before Dye tied her season-high with her fourth 3-pointer of the evening at the 17:17 mark. Senior Briana Phillips followed with a layup to increase the Gator lead to 48-24, but the Jaguars answered back by holding the Gators scoreless for the next two-and-a-half minutes while posting seven straight points. For the next seven minutes the teams traded points from the charity stripe, and Florida held onto a 20-point lead, 60-40, with eight minutes to play. The Jaguars decreased their deficit to 12 points, their lowest of the night, before the Gators notched two free throws with a minute left to seal the 71-57 victory.

Florida hit 43.6 percent from the field on 24-for-55 shooting, while IUPUI was just 19-61 (31.1 percent). The Gators also out-rebounded the Jaguars, 46-35, and found their way to the free throw line 10 more times.

All 12 Gators played, with 11 getting the score book, as leading scorer Sha Brooks saw limited action to rest shin splints and did not hit either of her shot attempts but did manage to dish three assists.

The Gators jumped out to an early 9-3 lead in the first half as Dye opened the game with a 3-pointer that was followed by a pair of layups from Phillips. After a three-minute scoring hiatus, Florida went on a 21-13 run that spanned more than six minutes and included two additional treys by Dye. The Gators' defense held the Jaguars scoreless for just over four minutes en route to a 37-16 lead with under five minutes to play, and closed the period with a 41-22 halftime lead.

"We wanted to play a lot of people tonight, since our schedule is so condensed these next few weeks. Everyone had an opportunity tonight, and we did pretty well. We still have a lot of work to do, but that's natural with a young team," Peck said.

Dotson was a perfect 4-for-4 from the field in the opening half, while Dye was 3-of-5 from beyond the arc.

IUPUI's Jernisha Cann recorded the lone double-double of the game with 12 points and 10 rebounds, while Alicia Booyer chipped in a game-high 17 points.

LaToya Bullard scored a career-high 18 points and led Florida's second-half rally which came up short as the Gators lost to Florida State 88-66 Friday afternoon at the Donald L. Tucker Civic Center.

After dominating the first half with three significant runs, FSU began the second period with a 14-3 spree to extend its lead to 37 points, 65-28, with 15:40 remaining in the game. That's when things started to click for the young Gators, who mounted a strong run of their own, ripping off a 28-6 run during the next nine-plus minutes that cut the significant deficit to 16 points, 71-55, with 6:31 left. Marshaë Dotson and Bullard came alive during the stretch, as Dotson scored nine points and Bullard seven. Shante Williams led FSU with 21 points, while Alicia Gladden added 18 that included a 12-of-15 effort from the free throw line, where the Seminoles were 26-of-40 for the game.

UF's Dotson hit the first bucket of the game, but Florida State countered with an 11-0 run over the next three-plus minutes and jumped out to a 13-2 lead. Depree Bowden stopped the run by putting back an offensive rebound. After a pair of FSU free throws, Briana Phillips ran the floor and collected a long pass from Bowden to convert the fast break and spark a 5-0 spree that got the Gators within six, 15-9, with just over 14 minutes left in the half.

The teams traded baskets, with Bullard grabbing a defensive rebound and dribbling coast to coast before dropping in a nifty layup at the 12-minute mark to keep the Gators within six points, 17-11. FSU then ripped off a devastating 17-0 run over the next three minutes to extend its lead to 23 points, 34-11. Game 7: Florida 86, Morehead State 54

Nov. 27, 2006 * Gainesville, Fla. * O'Connell Center

Junior guard Depree Bowden (Palmetto, Fla.) scored a career-high 19 points, and sophomore guard Sha Brooks (Jackson, Tenn.) chipped in with 18, to lead the University of Florida women's basketball team (3-4) to an 86-54 win over Morehead State (1-5) on Monday at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

Florida's 86 points are its highest total this season, and the most it has scored since a 98-83 win over Mississippi State on March 2, 2006. The Gators' 32-point margin of victory is their largest since defeating Stetson by 29 points, 85-56, on Nov. 7, 2005. The victory also extended UF's non-conference home winning streak to 14 games, dating back to Dec. 21, 2004.

Freshman guard LaKendra Phillips (Memphis, Tenn.) scored nine points to complement the 19 and 18-point efforts by Bowden and Brooks, respectively. Sophomore forward Marshaë Dotson (Columbus, Ohio) pulled down a team-high nine rebounds, and Brooks and freshman guard LaToya Bullard (Memphis, Tenn.) shared the team lead in assists, with four each.

"One of the biggest things we wanted to do tonight was do a better job with shot selection, and we also wanted to take care of the ball," Florida head coach Carolyn Peck said. "I think we did that tonight. We shot well, particularly in the first half, and that had something to do with our decisions. This was a good game for us to see that the good we're trying to do will work if we're patient."

Bowden scored 12 of the Gators' first 14 points of the contest, helping the team open up a 24-11 lead midway through the first half on the strength of a 14-2 run. She finished the period with 14 points on 7-of-12 shooting from the floor, helping UF shoot 53.8 percent (21-of-39) as a team in the first half. Florida closed the half on a 24-5 scoring string, including 10 points from Brooks, to open a 50-22 advantage at the break. The Gators' 50 points and 53.8 shooting percentage both marked first-half season highs.

Florida continued to increase its lead at the outset of the second half, outscoring the Eagles, 25-10, to open the half, and building a 75-34 margin with 10 minutes left to play. Senior forward Briana Phillips (Palmetto, Fla.) scored six of her eight points in the second frame, and freshman scored each of her nine points after the break, propelling the Gators to the 86-54 win. Florida finished the game 36-of-80 (45.0 percent) from the floor, and won the points-in-the-paint battle, 44-24.

Game 8: Florida 62, South Alabama 50 December 1, 2006 * Mobile, Ala. * Mitchell Center

Sha Brooks scored a career-high 17 points while Depree Bowden added her first career double-double leading Florida to a 62-50 victory over South Alabama at the Mitchell Center Friday evening. The victory was the Gator's first on the road this season, while handing the Jaguars (3-4) their first home loss.

Brooks ignited UF's second-half opening run with a pair of three-pointers, as she scored all of her points in the final 21 minutes. Bowden recorded 10 points with a career-high 15 rebounds, while Marshaë Dotson added 10 points and seven boards, as the Gators (4-4) held a 51-46 rebounding edge and got scoring from nine different players. Freshman LaToya Bullard had another solid performance, contributing five points, five rebounds, four steals and three assists.

Neither team shot well, as UF hit just 35 percent (21-60) from the floor, including an 18.8 percent (3-16) clip from the three-point arc, but held South Alabama to a mere 27.5 percent (19-69), including a 23.7 percent effort in the decisive second half when the Gators out-scored the hosts, 31-21.

Florida ripped out of the halftime locker room on a 12-0 run to take a 43-29 lead with 15:30 remaining. Sha Brooks ended the first half converting a three-point play and canned a pair of three-pointers to start UF's run. Marshaë Dotson then added the next two buckets after running the floor hard and being rewarded with transition layups. LaToya Bullard capped the run with an offensive rebound put-back.

The Jaguars continued to battle and answered with a 9-2 run to cut UF's lead to seven points, 45-38, with 10:39 on the clock. But Brooks countered with her third trey of the game to give the Gators a double-digit advantage again. The teams then traded three points for the next four minutes and UF's lead hovered between seven and 10 points.

UF strung together four straight points after Brooks coolly sank four consecutive free throws that gave the Gators an 11-point lead, 57-46, with 4:17 left in the game. Monique Jones followed with a transition break-a-way for USA, but Dotson hit a fall-away 10-footer from the baseline as the shot clock expired on UF's next possession to lift the lead back to 11 with 3:34 remaining and the Jaguars spirits seemed to fall, with the Gators answering every possession to keep the lead a double-figures the rest of the game.

The first half was extremely tight, with eight lead changes and six tie scores in the opening 20 minutes. South Alabama led by as many as six points, 14-8, with 13:53 remaining, before the Gators roared back with an 8-1 run to take a 16-15 advantage with 8:39 on the clock. Thomas contributed four points during the spree that also saw scoring from Bowden and Jennifer Mossor. From that point until the rest of the half, neither team was able to mount a significant run to get any distance. The Jaguars took a 29-26 lead with 1:11 left in the half before Sharielle Smith put-back on offensive rebound and Brooks converted a three-point play after anticipating a steal at the top of UF's defense and dribble the entire length of the court and sank a layup and a free throw after being fouled with 18 seconds remaining, as the Gators entered halftime with a 31-29 lead.

Game 9: Illinois 80, Florida 57 December 5, 2006 * Champaign, Ill. * Assembly Hall

Sha Brooks scored a career-high 27 points, while junior Depree Bowden continued her rebounding presence, collecting 12 for her second straight double-figure rebounding game, but a season-low shooting night resulted in an 80-57 loss to Illinois Tuesday evening at Assembly Hall.

Florida (4-5) just couldn't find its offensive stroke, shooting a season-low 29 percent (20-69) from the floor, including a 24 percent clip (7-29) in the first half, and just 2-of-22 from long range, while the Fighting Illini (7-2) hit 45.8 percent, including a 7-for-19 effort from the three-point arc.

Illinois closed the first half on a 19-2 run to break open a close game and hand Florida its fourth road loss of the season.

Bowden scored the first bucket of the second half and cut UF's halftime deficit to 15 points, 39-24, but Illinois responded with a 7-0 spurt and later used a 10-0 run to put the game out of reach.

Jenna Smith's 22 points led four Illinois players in double-figures, as the Fighting Illini enjoyed a 54-33 rebounding advantage en route to their sixth consecutive home victory.

Florida did force 21 turnovers which it converted into 27 points, while committing just 10 miscues of its own.

Sha Brooks was all over the court in the opening minutes of the game, having a hand in all of the Gator's first three scoring plays that lifted UF to a 5-0 lead. Illinois fought back and whittled the lead down to one, 10-9, with just under 15 minutes left in the half.

Brooks then canned a three-pointer and Jennifer Mossor stole the ensuing in-bound pass and sank a layup to extend UF's lead to six points, 15-9, with 14:22 on the clock.

That's when Illinois' Lori Bjork hit a trey to spark an 11-0 run over the next three minutes as the home team took a 20-15 advantage with a little under 11 minutes left in the period.

The Gators battled right back with a 5-0 run to tie the score at 20-all, as Kim Dye and Briana Phillips each converted driving layups and Jessica Jackson hit one free throw. Unfortunately, that would be the last time UF's offense would click in the half, as the Fighting Illini went on a devastating 17-0 run in just under eight minutes to roar out to a 37-20 lead with 1:14 remaining. Depree Bowden finally stopped the run, but Jenna Smith answered with a bucket to end of the half's scoring, with Illinois holding a 39-22 lead.

Florida shot a woeful 24.1 percent (7-29) in the first half, hitting just 1-of-9 from long range, and was out-rebounded 24-16. Illinois nailed 45.4 percent (15-33) of its shots and held a slim 14-10 advantage in points in the paint.

The Gators did score 10 points off six Illinois turnovers, while committing just four miscues during the opening 20 minutes.

Game 10: TCU 83, Florida 72

December 8, 2006 * Fort Worth, Texas * Daniel-Meyer Coliseum

Florida played its best game of the season, but couldn't overcome a red-hot TCU squad, falling 83-72 at the Daniel-Meyer Coliseum in front of a crowd of 2,359. Depree Bowden posted her second career double-double, leading the Gators with 19 points and 10 rebounds, while Marsha Dotson scored 19 points, one shy of her career-high, with seven rebounds and Sha Brooks added 14 points and tied her career-best of eight rebounds.

Helen Roden canned a 3-pointer on the opening possession of the second half to give TCU (5-3) a 37-26 lead. After the teams traded scores, Dotson hit a short jumper before LaToya Bullard and Kim Dye converted back-to-three-point plays and Gators were back within one, 45-44, with 13:59 remaining. UF's defense held on the next possession and its offense had the momentum with a chance to take the lead, but Brooks' pass inside to Bowden was just off the mark resulting in the Gator's 21st turnover of the game. TCU capitalized, halting UF's 8-0 run by scoring the next five points to lift its lead to six with just under 13 minutes remaining in the game. Florida chipped away and reduced the deficit to three points twice, but TCU found a way to hit clutch shots of its own and kept the Gators at a distance, always seeming to answer a UF run with one of its own.

The Gators reduced an 11-point deficit with 5:49 remaining down to six points, 68-62, with just under three minutes left, but Adrienne Ross came out of a timeout with a back-breaking 3-pointer and TCU was able to match UF, going 6-for-6 from the free throw line in the final minute of the game to secure its fifth straight win.

Florida shot 47.2 percent (25-52) in the game, while hitting 18-of-24 from the free throw line, but missed a few clutch shots from the line late in the game. The Gators also ended the game with a 38-31 rebounding edge, but their 28 turnovers were too much to overcome, as the Frogs converted those into 23 points.

Adrienne Ross scored a game-high 22 points for TCU, while committed 16 turnovers and shot a steady 42.4 percent in its fifth straight home appearance.

Turnovers were the story of the first half, when the Gators committed a total of 18 miscues that the Frogs converted into 15 points en route to a 34-26 lead.

TCU jumped out to a 6-2 lead in the opening couple of minutes before Florida rallied with a 15-4 run in the next four-plus minutes to take a 17-10 advantage with 11:29 on the clock. Several of the Frogs 10 second-half turnovers came during this span, also during which forced a TCU turnover after Bowden crashed the boards, collecting during one series three consecutive offensive rebounds, eventually getting fouled and sinking a pair of free throws. TCU regrouped with a blistering 13-0 run, with Ashley Davis hitting two 3-pointers and Jenna Lohse adding another during the spree to give the hosts a 23-16 lead with 7:46 remaining. Kim Dye stopped the run with a trey from the left corner. After one TCU free throw, Briana Phillips powered up a short jumper in the paint and the Gators were within two, 24-22, with 6:49 left in the period.

That's when the Lady Frogs ripped off a 10-0 spree and assumed a 34-22 lead with 1:52 remaining. Florida refused to fold and scored the final four points of the half as Dotson converted a nice feed into the paint from Brittaney Thomas and Bowden banked in an 8-foot jumper.

Game 11: Florida 72, Stetson 55

December 18, 2006 * Gainesville, Fla. * Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Sophomore guard Sha Brooks (Jackson, Tenn.) netted 19 points and collected a career-high nine steals to lead the University of Florida women's basketball team to a 72-55 victory over Stetson at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center on Monday night. The performance marked the 125th career win for Gators' head coach Carolyn Peck, as well as the team's 15th-consecutive non-conference triumph on its home court.

Brooks' 19 points led all scorers, while also hauling in five rebounds and dishing out a team-high three assists; her nine steals were also just one away from the school record. Junior guard Depree Bowden (Palmetto, Fla.) and sophomore guard Kim Critton (Memphis, Tenn.) both paced the Gators with six rebounds, a career-high effort for Critton. Sophomore center Jessica Jackson (Collierville, Tenn.) led all UF bench players with six points and a pair of rebounds.

"After having a week without a game and going through finals, I think that our team came together," Peck said. "Sha Brooks did a good job for us on both ends of the floor. She did a good job of getting to open spots and knocking down mid-range shots."

Florida (5-6) used a 12-2 run midway through the second half to take control of the game, opening a 53-37 lead with just over 11 minutes left in regulation. The Gators shot 44.4 percent (28-of-63) from the field during the contest, including a 54.2 percent effort in the second half, while also out-rebounding Stetson, 39-34. Sophomore forward Marsha Dotson (Columbus, Ohio) scored seven of her nine points in the second frame, including five during the game-opening run.

The Gators finished the first half on a 12-2 run, highlighted by a three-point field goal by Dotson as the buzzer sounded, to head to the locker room with a 37-25 advantage. Bowden scored seven points during the spurt, and finished the half with nine on 3-of-7 shooting. Brooks tallied during the opening frame with 13 points, pacing a UF attack that hit 5-of-11 shots (45.5 percent) from beyond the arc in the first half.

The Hatters were led by 14 points from guard Jamie Nesbit, as well as 13 from backcourt mate Kim Manning. Forward Janene Maclin and guard Kellie Olson each grabbed a team-high six boards, while Manning handed out a game-high four assists, for Stetson.

"Points off of turnovers were the difference in the game tonight," Stetson head coach Dee Romine said. "Florida's pressure wears on you and creates fatigue, and that makes it tough."

Game 12: No. 16/14 Louisville 77, Florida 60

December 21, 2006 * Gainesville, Fla. * Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Sha Brooks scored a team-high 16 points and Marshae Dotson notched her first double-double of the season to lead a tenacious Florida rebounding effort Thursday, but No. 16/14 Louisville held off a late Gator rally for a 77-60 win in the O'Connell Center.

The Gators (5-7), looking for their 16th consecutive non-conference home victory, trimmed a 20-point second-half deficit to 11 points, 51-40, with 13:43 remaining but were unable to complete the rally against the unbeaten Cardinals (13-0).

Florida was strong on the boards, falling just short in the rebound battle, 46-45, led by Dotson's career-high 13 boards. Dotson added 14 points for her third career double-double. The Gators were forced to contend with a hot shooting night by the Cardinals. Louisville connected on 48.5 percent (34-of-70) of its shots from the floor and had two players eclipse the 20-point plateau, as Angel McCoughtry led all scorers with 27 points and brought down a game-high 14 rebounds, while Covington added 23 points and nine boards.

Brooks, playing a season-high 40 minutes, recorded her sixth consecutive double-figure scoring game and also tied her career high with five assists. Freshman guard Jennifer Mossor scored a career-high nine points, while classmate Brittaney Thomas also had a career-high eight points. UF's bench stepped up big, out-scoring the Louisville reserves 18-10.

Florida hung tough with the Cardinals despite a difficult shooting night. The Gators shot 34.8 percent (24-of-69) from the floor and just 43.8 percent (7-of-16) from the free-throw line. Louisville's size advantage proved a key in the game - the Cardinals have nine players taller than 6-foot - as it out-scored the Gators 42-30 in the paint and 19-7 on second-chance opportunities.

Louisville, which led 39-25 at intermission, stormed out of the locker room at halftime to build a 19-point (44-25) advantage after five consecutive points by all-America candidate Jazz Covington. With the Cardinals leading 47-27, Mossor canned back-to-back three-pointers to bring Florida within 16, 49-33.

The Gators continued chipping away at the Louisville advantage with three consecutive baskets by Brooks, the last of which was a three-pointer, to close within 11, 51-40, with 13:43 remaining. From there, the Cardinals scored nine unanswered points to go up 60-40 with 11:09 left, but Florida would not back down.

Four different Gators nailed consecutive hoops to bring Florida within 12, 60-48, with 8:30 left, but that would be as close as it would come. Louisville built its lead back out to 18 points, 74-56, with 3:04 left and didn't look back.

Strong shooting by the Cardinals in the first half allowed them to take a 39-23 advantage into the locker room. Louisville shot a blistering 50 percent (18-of-36) from the floor in the opening period after struggling out of the gates. The Gators were tenacious on the boards in the first half, out-rebounding Louisville 24-22.

Florida broke to an early 5-2 advantage after a pair of baskets by Brooks, but the Cardinals rallied to knot the score at 5. The teams continued to trade baskets, but Louisville used a 7-0 run to take an 18-10 lead with 12:03 remaining until halftime. After the Gators came within six, 22-16, Louisville went on a 9-2 run over the next 3:58 to go ahead 31-18 with 6:28 left.

The 60-point victory marked the largest in tournament history, surpassing the previous record of 46 points which was set by the Gators exactly six years ago against Tennessee State. Florida's 99 points was just one point shy of tying a tournament record for points scored in a single game, which was also set in Florida's 2000 contest against Tennessee State. The margin also was the largest for Florida under head coach Carolyn Peck.

Sophomore guard Kim Critton (Memphis, Tenn.) and freshman forward Sharielle Smith (Bradenton, Fla.) also set career-bests with 12 points each, while junior guard Depree Bowden (Palmetto, Fla.) also added 12 points. Sophomore guard Sha Brooks (Jackson, Tenn.) and senior guard Kim Dye (Fayetteville, Tenn.) chipped in 11 each, and all 10 players that saw action contributed a minimum of six points apiece.

"The best thing about tonight was the total team effort. All 10 players that could play tonight understood their roles and did what we asked them to do. The balanced scoring made me very proud, from the five players who started the game to the five players who came in off the bench," Florida head coach Carolyn Peck said.

"Kim (Critton) has been working very hard in practice lately, and it definitely showed tonight," Peck added.

The Gators (6-7) opened the game with a 12-0 run that spanned four minutes and featured a pair of treys by Dye. The Hornets (3-7, 0-0 SWAC) put up their first point of the game at the 15:55 mark with a basket from the charity stripe which preceded a second double-digit rally by Florida that ended eight minutes into the half with Alabama State's first field goal of the game. Over the next seven minutes, the Orange and Blue increased its lead to 39-7 with the help from six scorers and four-straight free throws by Critton. UF closed the half with a 34-point halftime lead and held Alabama State to just 14 points, marking a season-low halftime total by an opponent this season.

Florida shot 35.5 percent from field-goal range on 11-31 shooting, while Alabama State shot just 17.2 percent (5-of-29) during the half. The Gators notched 23 points off the Hornets' 23 turnovers while committing four for two points.

Sophomore forward Marshae Dotson (Columbus, Ohio) led all scorers in the opening half of the second period as she rattled off nine of the Gators' first 24 points. She notched her first basket less than two minutes in and followed with a three-point play one minute later. After Dotson added four additional points on a layup and pair of free throws, Florida went on a 10-minute, 17-8 run for an 82-28 lead with under seven minutes to play. The two teams traded shots from beyond the arc before UF closed the game on a 13-4 run.

"We all worked together tonight, and it was definitely a team effort. When you're playing together as a team, it makes the game a lot more fun," Dye said.

Capri Taylor led Alabama State with eight points, and Airel Anderson and L'Teisha Holloway each added seven.

Game 14: Nebraska 81, Florida 73 (State Farm Classic - Championship) December 29, 2006 * Gainesville, Fla. * Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Despite a career-high 21 points from sophomore forward Marshae Dotson (Columbus, Ohio), the University of Florida women's basketball team dropped a hard-fought game with Nebraska, 81-73, on Friday night in the championship game of the 2006 State Farm Classic at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center. The eight-point differential marked the smallest margin in the 16-year history of the State Farm Classic championship game since the Gators defeated Rutgers by eight, 66-58, in the 2000 edition of the tournament.

Sophomore guard Sha Brooks (Jackson, Tenn.) led Florida (6-8) with a 24-point effort, including a 9-of-9 performance from the free-throw line, that put her just three points away from her career best. Dotson's 10 rebounds paced the team, and combined with her 21 points to represent her second double-double of the season, and the fourth of her collegiate career. Freshman guard Jennifer Mossor (Orlando, Fla.) chipped in with a team-high four assists in the outing.

"I was pleased with our effort, especially the way we closed the lead and showed a lot of effort," Florida head coach Carolyn Peck said. "For our team to show that kind of fight in the second half was a good step forward for us. Nebraska is a heck of a ball club."

Dotson, who earned a spot on the State Farm Classic All-Tournament team, scored the Gators' first six points of the contest, sparking a 14-5 game-opening Florida run. UF shot nearly 40 percent from the field in the opening period, while also outscoring the Huskers in the paint and on the fast break. Brooks capped the first half for Florida with her lone three-point field goal of the frame just before the buzzer, sending her team into the break trailing by just nine, 40-31.

UF cut the margin to two with a 9-2 spurt, on the strength of two 3-point field goals from Mossor, to open the second half. After Nebraska went up by as many as seven points, a three-point play from Brooks pulled the Gators to within three with just under 15 minutes left in regulation. An 8-0 Husker run ran their lead back to 11 with just over 12 minutes to play, though UF would battle back to within three at the six-minute mark after Dotson reeled off a streak of seven consecutive points for the Gators. Brooks, who joined classmate Dotson on the SFC all-tournament squad, knocked down a runner in the lane with 1:30 left to play, pulling the Gators to within one, but nine Nebraska free throws down the stretch sealed the final 81-73 margin.

"We changed our mindset to winning the game, instead of being defeated, and we played with a lot of heart in the second half," Peck said. "We did a good job of taking care of the basketball against a good defensive team, and we were really aggressive on the offensive end when we needed to be."

In the consolation game on Friday afternoon, N.C. State defeated Alabama State, 74-33, behind game highs of 16 points and eight rebounds from junior Khadijah Whittington. Sophomore L'Teisha Holloway paced the Hornets with 15 points, while redshirt freshman Jasmon Hazley pulled down a team-high five rebounds.

Depree Bowden (Palmetto, Fla.) recorded a career-high 25 points and sophomore Sha Brooks (Jackson, Tenn.) added 26 more, but it wasn't enough to fend off a late second-half rally, as the Gators lost to Temple in overtime, 85-80, Tuesday afternoon at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

Florida (6-9) led by 10 points, 66-56, with four minutes remaining in regulation, but managed just one field goal the rest of the period, as the Owls (9-4) tied up the game, 70-70, and forced overtime.

Temple came out quickly in the extra stanza, as Kamesha Hairston, who finished with a game-high 34 points and 10 rebounds, sank a layup off the tip. Bowden countered with a jumper in the paint to even the score, before TU's Shenita Landry hit two free throws to give the Owls a 74-72 lead.

The Owls pushed their overtime lead to six points, 78-72, but the Gators battled back and were within two, 78-76, after Marshae Dotson's layin with 2:27 remaining. After two more Temple free throws, Brooks slashed the lane for a jumper to get the Gators within three, 81-78, with 1:18 on the clock and had a chance to tie, but Kim Dye's three-pointer from the right corner was on-line, but just short, hitting the front of the rim and Hairston collected the miss and the Owls sealed the win from the free throw line.

"You have to compliment Temple because they did a tremendous job on commanding the boards. We simply didn't do a good job of taking care of the ball with our 25 turnovers, and between the turnovers and rebounds, we sacrificed the game," Florida head coach Carolyn Peck said. "This is an experience that our team hasn't been in yet this year. Hopefully, this experience proves to be a very good teacher for us."

Temple won the rebounding battle, 46-38, collecting 25 on the offensive end, while shooting 44.2 percent in the game, including 54.3 percent in the second half and 80 percent (4-5) in overtime. Lakeisha Eaddy and Shenita Landry added 18 and 11 points, respectively, to join Hairston in double-figure scoring, while Lady Comfort collected a game-high 11 rebounds with eight points.

Florida hit 46.3 percent (31-67) of its shots but committed 25 turnovers during the 45 minutes. The Gators led by as many as 14 points, 30-16, with 5:15 remaining in the first half, but Temple never surrendered, closing the opening period on a 7-2 run to cut UF's lead to 32-24 by halftime. Temple also used a 16-6 run in the final four minutes of regulation to force overtime.

Florida turned the ball over four times during overtime, but hit 5-of-9 from the floor. Temple canned 4-of-5, but converted 7-of-9 from the free throw line while the Gators did not manage one trip.

"I had too many turnovers - eight is unacceptable for me. I definitely learned a lesson in taking better care of the ball today," UF's Brooks said.

Game 16: No. 15 Georgia 89, Florida 57

January 4, 2007 * Athens, Ga. * Stegeman Coliseum

Marsha Dotson scored a career-high 22 points and Florida was outscored by just three points in the second half by 14th-ranked Georgia, but it wasn't enough to overcome a significant halftime deficit as the Gators dropped an 89-57 decision to the Bulldogs at Stegeman Coliseum in the Southeastern Conference opener for both teams.

Georgia (13-2) ended the first half on a devastating 20-2 run to take a commanding 52-23 halftime lead and the Gators (6-10) never recovered, falling to the rival Bulldogs for the sixth straight time. UG hit 9-of-18 from the three-point arc to propel a hot-shooting first half for the home team, which shot 54.1 percent (20-37), while Florida struggled with a 32.1 percent (9-28) mark.

Chambers scored 18 of her game-high 23 points in the decisive first half, hitting four of her five three-pointers, en route to Georgia's 12-of-26 effort from behind the arc during the game and 47.1 percent (32-68) overall from the floor. Florida converted 36.4 percent on the night, but just 2-of-15 from long range while committing 22 turnovers.

UF's Sha Brooks reached double-figures for the 10th straight game, contributing 10 points, as eight of the nine Gators scored in the game. For Dotson, it was her third career 20-point game, while she also collected a team-high nine rebounds.

Florida and Georgia traded scores for the first eight minutes of the second half, with neither team able to string together consecutive points, as the Gators were unable to chip away at the first half deficit. UF finally broke the trend after Sha Brooks hit a pull-up jumper in the lane and Brittaney Thomas followed with a driving layup with just over 11 minutes left in the game. Those buckets helped spark a 7-2 Gator run, as Florida got within 26 points, 68-42, with just under nine minutes remaining. Brooks also hit two free throws during the spree, extending her career-high made streak to 22, but missed her next attempt.

Dotson opened the game's scoring, powering in a jumper from under the bucket. Janese Hardrick countered with a three-pointer for Georgia before Jennifer Mossor sank a short jumper to spot the Gators a 4-3 lead.

That's when Cori Chambers got hot from the perimeter, as she nailed a pair of 3-pointers during a quick 8-0 run that lifted Georgia to a 11-4 lead. During that run, Sha Brooks, UF's leading scorer, left the game with an injured left shin. When she returned to the court four and half minutes later, the Bulldogs built a 23-10 lead with 9:57 remaining in the first half. Georgia added to its advantage with another bucket from Chambers, who scored 18 points during the first half.

With the Bulldogs holding a 32-15 lead, Dotson sparked a 6-0 spree and closed the gap to 11 points, 32-11, with 5:08 left in the period, forcing a Georgia timeout. The Bulldogs returned to the court and immediately ripped off the next 10 points. Dotson halted the run with another power lay-in, but UG closed the half scoring the final 10 points to take a commanding 52-23 halftime lead. Georgia shot a sizzling 9-for-18 from the three-point arc, paced by Chambers' 4-of-6 effort. Dotson accounted for 14 of UF's 23 points and three rebounds, as the Gators trailed just 23-17 on the boards to the taller Bulldogs.

Depree Bowden (Palmetto, Fla.) just missed a double-double with 16 points and nine rebounds, and sophomore Marsha Dotson (Columbus, Ohio) also scored in double figures with 20 points, but it wasn't enough for the University of Florida women's basketball team to overcome a staggering 25-0 game-opening run by No. 4 Tennessee Thursday night in an 80-58 loss at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

The Lady Vols (15-1, 2-0 Southeastern Conference) raced out to an early 25-0 lead in the first 7:22 of the game before the Gators' (6-11, 0-2 SEC) recorded their first points of the night on a jumper by Dotson at the 12:19 mark. Senior Briana Phillips (Palmetto, Fla.) chipped in four additional points and Dotson added two more before Tennessee went on a 10-0 run to lead 39-8 with 8:17 left in the period. UT's Candace Parker hit a jumper at the 7:36 mark, but it was the final basket the Lady Vols would score before the Gators went on a momentum-changing 18-5 run that spanned the final five minutes of the half and resulted in a 44-26 UT halftime lead.

Bowden notched all nine of her first-half points during Florida's scoring spree, while sophomore Sha Brooks (Jackson, Tenn.) added six on a pair from long distance.

Freshman Sharielle Smith (Bradenton, Fla.) finished the game with six points and a team-high nine rebounds for the Gators, while Brooks contributed eight points and four assists.

Tennessee capitalized on 13 Florida turnovers in the opening stanza for 14 points, and added 13 points on second-chance attempts. The Lady Vols' bench narrowly out-scored the Gators' bench 8-6, and recorded 24 rebounds to Florida's 22. Florida shot 85.7 percent (6-of-7) from the free throw line, 33.3 percent (9-of-27) from the field and 66.7 (2-of-3) from long range, while Tennessee was 18-of-42 (42.9) from the field, 6-of-10 (60.0) from the arc and 2-of-7 (28.6) from the stripe in the opening half.

The second half was a back-and-forth battle as the two teams traded points until Florida controlled the ball in a 6-0 rally six minutes into the half. Smith, Dotson and Brooks all contributed one field goal apiece to trail by 19 points, 56-37. Tennessee spent the next five minutes climbing back to a 70-44 lead, but Florida answered with a 10-4 run that put the Gators within 20 with three minutes to play.

Jennifer Mossor (Orlando, Fla.) nailed a 3-pointer with two minutes remaining on the clock and Dotson went 1-of-2 from the line before Tennessee hit a series of three-straight baskets for the 80-58 victory, marking the Lady Vols' ninth straight win.

Tennessee had three players in double figures, with Sidney Spencer tallying a game-high 21 points. Candace Parker recorded 19 points, nine rebounds and a game-high three blocks, while Alexis Hornbuckle notched a double-double and just missed a triple-double finishing with 10 points, 10 assists and nine rebounds.

Game 18: No. 14/12 Vanderbilt 82, Florida 69 January 14, 2007 * Nashville, Tenn. * Memorial Gym

Depree Bowden scored a game and career-high 28 points, but it wasn't enough to carry Florida past No. 14/12 Vanderbilt, as the Gators lost 82-69 Sunday afternoon at Memorial Gym in front of a crowd of 8,511. The Commodores used a 24-8 run early in the second half to erase the Gators' 33-28 halftime lead and take a 58-48 advantage midway through the second half and Florida just couldn't make up the difference, as Vanderbilt sealed the game hitting 12-of-16 from the free throw line in the final 1:39 to hand the Gators their fifth straight loss.

Bowden, who shot 10-of-16 from the floor and 6-of-6 from the free throw line, also collected a game-high 13 rebounds to record her third career double-double. Sha Brooks added 16 points with five assists, while Marshaë Dotson battled for 10 points and six rebounds. Christina Wirth led five Vanderbilt players in double-figure scoring with 20 points, as the Commodores shot 46.7 percent (28-60) in the game, including a 56.7 percent mark in the decisive second half when they outscored the Gators, 54-36. Florida hit 38.7 percent from the floor, but just 31.4 percent (24-62) in the final 20 minutes. Both teams were steady at the free throw line, where Vanderbilt hit 22-of-28 and the Gators converted 16-of-17.

Vanderbilt scored the first four points of the second half, reducing Florida's halftime lead to two points, 33-31, before Bowden scored the next four points of the game and sparked a 7-2 run, when she also capped the run with a trey, to give the Gators a 37-33 advantage with 16:39 remaining. But the Commodores' Christina Wirth immediately answered Bowden's trey with one of her own that ignited an 11-0 run to give the hosts a 44-40 lead with just under 14 minutes left in the game. Brooks stopped the run and the teams traded scores for the next two minutes before VU got consecutive buckets that started a 9-2 march and extended the Gator deficit to 10 points, 58-48, with 9:38 remaining.

Kim Dye sank a deep three-pointer and Bowden drowned a pair from the charity stripe to get UF within five, 58-53, with 7:19 on the clock. But the Gators went cold from the floor for the next two minutes, when Vandy built its lead to 11, 64-53 with 5:19 remaining. The teams again traded scores over the next two minutes until Bowden hit a running jumper and Brooks converted a three-point play to get the Gators within six points, 68-62, with just over three minutes left in the game.

Florida played solid defense on its next possession, but VU's Liz Sherwood putback an offensive rebound with the shot clock expiring. The Gators couldn't convert on their trip down the floor and the Commodores made them pay, as they collected multiple offensive boards on their next trip with Florida eventually fouling to stop the clock with 1:39 remaining.

UF's first five baskets were scored by five different players, as the Gators used smothering defense and unselfish passing to jump out to a 15-7 lead in the first eight-plus minutes of the game. Bowden and Dotson each had two buckets, while Brooks, Dye and Sharielle Smith all contributed during the game-opening stretch.

Vanderbilt chipped away using a 7-2 run to reduce UF's lead to three, 17-14, with 8:14 remaining in the opening half. Florida kept its pressure on and regrouped with a 7-2 run of its own, as Jennifer Mossor hit two free throws and Bowden tallied the other five points that included a trey, lifting the Gator lead back to eight points, 24-16, with five minutes remaining in the half. The 'Dores then countered with a 10-2 run and tied the score at 26-all with 1:52 on the clock, but Florida settled and ended the half on a 7-2 spree thanks to a deep three-pointer from Brooks with two seconds remaining, as the Gators took a 33-28 halftime lead.

Sophomores Marshaë Dotson (Columbus, Ohio) and Sha Brooks (Jackson, Tenn) combined for 50 points, but it still wasn't enough to carry Florida to its first Southeastern Conference win, falling to Auburn, 74-69, Thursday night at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center in front of a crowd of 2,023.

The Gators (6-13, 0-4 SEC) again showed their fight after spotting the Tigers a 14-point lead to open the game, as Brooks knotted the game at 48-48 on a slashing lay-up with 11:03 remaining. Auburn (15-5, 2-2 SEC), however, answered with a 9-0 run to go up, 57-48, with 8:17 remaining.

The Gators refused to fold, bouncing back with an 8-0 run to bring the game within one, 57-56, at the 5:47 on the clock. The game remained a close contest until the end, as Florida trailed only two with 0:26 remaining before Auburn sank three free throws to give the game its final margin.

Dotson's career-high 26 points led all scorers. It was her fifth time scoring at least 20 points this season, tallying four of those in the last six games. She also added a team-high eight rebounds. Brooks added 24 points in the combined 50-point effort, before fouling out with 24.1 seconds remaining marking the first time in her career she reached the five-foul limit.

Florida closed the first half on a 15-1 run over the final 5:13 to enter the locker room down just two, 29-27. With Auburn leading 28-12, Brooks sparked Florida's closing run scoring the game's next seven points and finishing the run with nine points. Dotson came up big with the remaining six points of the run, including the half's final four points. The run included an 11-0 stretch that was ended by a free throw from Auburn's Jordan Greenleaf. The Tigers built the advantage by opening the game with a 14-0 run of their own. Brooks and Dotson led the Gators in scoring through the first period with 11 points each.

For Auburn, DeWanna Bonner netted a double-double, tying for the team-high with 21 points while pulling in 15 rebounds. Whitney Boddie also contributed 21 points for the Tigers. Auburn was 22-of-34 (64.7 percent) from the charity stripe including five free throws in the final 0:49 seconds - three from Boddie and two from Bonner. Boddie finished the night going 11-for-14 from the line. The Gators shot 60.0 percent from the line going 9-for-15 including 4-for-5 performances from both Dotson and Brooks. From beyond the arc, the Gators held the edge, making four baskets while not allowing the Tigers to make a three-pointer going 0-for-6.

Sha Brooks recorded a career-high 28 points and sophomore Marsha Dotson also reached double digits for the fifth-straight game by chipping in 14 points, but it wasn't enough for the University of Florida women's basketball team to fend off a strong second-half performance by Arkansas as the Gators fell 67-57 Sunday afternoon in the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

Florida allowed visiting Tennessee and Auburn to jump out to big early leads in its last two home games, as the Gators were forced to play catch-up. On Sunday, Florida came ready to play, building a 15-point lead, 25-10 with 5:50 remaining in the first half, but couldn't close the period with the same intensity, as Arkansas whittled the Gators' halftime lead to six, 28-22.

After increasing its lead to eight points just moments into the second half, Florida (6-14, 0-5 SEC) allowed Arkansas to inch within three less than three minutes into the period. Brooks and Dotson combined for all six of the Gators points in the first three minutes while the Lady Razorbacks posted nine points to trail, 34-31.

Brooks nailed her fourth trey of the afternoon and Dotson added two additional points to build Florida's lead to 39-31, but Arkansas wouldn't back down and capitalized on a 6-2 run to cut the Gators' lead to two, 41-39, with 11 minutes remaining in the half.

Following a basket by Brooks at the 10:57 mark, Arkansas' Dominique Washington closed the gap further with a trey for a one-point Florida lead. The teams traded points from the charity stripe, but it wasn't until the 7:07 mark that Arkansas knotted the score at 46-all on a free throw by Brittny Vaughn. Smith laid one in 30 seconds later to reclaim the Gators' lead, but Arkansas' Donica Cosby recorded a pair from the line to tie the game again. Brooks came within one of her former career-high 27 points with a basket from the line before Arkansas' Vaughn put it back in the lead and Cosby added five more points for a six-point UA lead, 55-49, with four minutes remaining.

Dotson's bucket at the 3:55 mark put UF back within four, and after trading points, Arkansas put in two straight for a 61-54 lead. Brooks answered with a pair from the line, but it wasn't enough as the Lady 'Backs hit 4-of-6 from the line in the final seconds and added a layup for the 67-57 win.

The Gators came out strong in the opening half as they answered the Lady Razorbacks' first basket of the game with a 9-0 run that featured four points by Brooks, a layup from Dotson and a trey by senior Kim Dye (Fayetteville, Tenn.). After a pair of Arkansas layups, Florida held a 9-6 lead at the 12:35 mark before Brooks rattled off three straight 3-pointers for the largest lead of the half, 25-10. The two teams traded the next few baskets, and Florida held a 10-point lead, 26-16, with four minutes remaining. Arkansas' defense allowed Florida just one basket, a layup by Dotson, in the final span, and it used a 6-2 run to cut the Gators' halftime lead to six points, 28-22.

Brooks tallied 15 of her 28 points in the first half on 6-of-14 shooting, including 3-of-7 from long distance. Bowden pulled down six boards in the opening stanza, and Dye chipped in an additional six points on 2-of-5 shooting from beyond the arc. As a team, the Gators out-shot the Lady Razorbacks 35.5 percent (11-of-31) to 28.1 percent (9-of-32).

Florida freshman Sharielle Smith (Bradenton, Fla.) recorded three points and six rebounds in her first collegiate start, while and Dye and junior Depree Bowden (Palmetto, Fla.) added six and four points, respectively. Bowden led the Gators with nine rebounds, while Brooks dished out a team-high four assists with four steals. The Lady 'Backs' Lauren Ervin pulled down 20 boards, including seven offensive rebounds, to set an Arkansas SEC single-game record. Ervin's 10 points led to her ninth double-double of the season, and Washington (11), Vaughn (14) and Cosby (15) and each scored in double figures.

Junior Depree Bowden (Palmetto, Fla.) recorded her fourth double-double of the season and of her career, but it wasn't enough to overcome Florida's first-half shooting woes, as the Gators dropped a 79-51 decision to South Carolina Thursday evening at the Colonial Center.

South Carolina (12-9, 2-4 SEC) opened the game on a 24-5 run spanning 12 minutes and Florida never recovered, dropping its eighth consecutive game, the second-longest span in program history, as the Gators fell to 6-15 overall and 0-6 in Southeastern Conference play.

"The turnovers was the thing I was most disappointed with in the first half was our turnovers," said UF head coach Carolyn Peck, whose Gators committed 24 miscues that South Carolina converted into 34 points. "The turnovers were a nightmare. Not only did we turn the ball over, but we were passive offensively, we weren't cutting hard to the basket. But what's most disappointing was that we didn't play anywhere close to how we played against Auburn."

Bowden scored 19 points with 11 rebounds, while adding five steals and four assists in 39 minutes of action. Sha Brooks (Jackson, Tenn.), who scored 15 points in limited action, connected on her 10th career 3-pointer with 4:07 remaining in the game, becoming the seventh Gator to knock down as many while scoring in double-figures for the 14th time in the last 15 games.

"Part of the reason for the ugly start was that Sha Brooks, who started the game, had really sore knees and was limping pretty bad so we had to take her out early," Peck said. "No one really stepped up in her absence and it really hurt."

USC's Melanie Johnson led all scorers with 22 points and 12 rebounds off the bench for the Gamecocks, who shot 42.7 percent (32-75) in the game and out-rebounded the smaller Gators, 54-45.

Florida hit 42.4 percent during the second half, but just 30.8 percent in the game.

Florida was its own worst enemy in the first half, committing 12 turnovers which South Carolina converted into 19 points. The Gators shot a woeful 18.8 percent (6-32) in the first 20 minutes while forcing just four turnovers, converting none into points, as the Gamecocks roared out to a 35-16 halftime lead.

Bowden scored quickly off the opening tip for Florida, but that would be the last Gator field goal until Marsha Dotson's (Columbus, Ohio) at the 15:37 mark which brought the score to 12-5. USC then ripped off a 12-0 run over the next five and half minutes to build a 19-point lead, 24-5. The Gators tried to rally with a 7-1 spree that cut the deficit to 13 points, 25-12, with 5:48 remaining. The momentum was cut short, however, as the Gamecocks countered with an 8-0 march that lifted their lead to 21 points with just under three minutes left in the half.

Bowden was the most productive Gator in the opening period, scoring eight points with seven rebounds, as Florida was even in the rebounding battle with the taller Gamecocks, who shot 40 percent (16-40) and had a 10-0 advantage in fast break points.

Ten different Gamecocks got into the scoring column, one more player than Florida's entire roster contained, while UF's 16 first-half points were the second-fewest scored in an opening half by a Gator team in an SEC game.

Sophomore forward Marsha Dotson (Columbus, Ohio) scored 13 of her game-high 20 points in the second half, but it was not enough to prevent the University of Florida women's basketball team from dropping a 77-54 decision to 14th-ranked Georgia on Sunday at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

Dotson came out the break with a hot hand, scoring Florida's first 11 points of the second half, pulling the Gators (6-16, 0-7 SEC) within six, 44-38, with just over 15 minutes remaining in regulation. A layup by freshman Sharielle Smith (Bradenton, Fla.) cut the deficit to 49-45 at the 12:32 mark of the second half, and Dotson kept UF within four with a layup of her own at the 9:30 mark. A 10-0 run for UGA (18-4, 5-2 SEC) in the ensuing minutes stretched its lead to 63-49 before senior guard Kim Dye (Fayetteville, Tenn.) drilled a shot from long distance to snap the streak and bring the Gators to within 11 points. UF, however, would get no closer, as the Lady Bulldogs finished the game on a 14-2 run to take the 77-54 win.

"For about 75 percent of the game, our team did a pretty good job," Florida head coach Carolyn Peck said. "We had some crucial turnovers, and Georgia is a good enough team to capitalize on those. We actually out-rebounded Georgia (38-36). We bounced back after the South Carolina game and got back into the fight, which are things that were pleasing to me."

Dotson's 20 points, her fifth 20-point effort in UF's last nine outings, came in addition to six rebounds and three steals. Junior guard Depree Bowden (Palmetto, Fla.) chipped in 12 points and 13 rebounds to collect the fifth double-double of her season and career; her 13 rebounds marked her fifth career game with a double-digit rebounding total and were just two away from her career high. Bowden also distributed a team-high three assists in the contest.

"We were confident throughout the game because we know our ability to play hard," Dotson said. "We knew that we just had to play well to come out with the win. We came up a little short, but that happens sometimes. We just have to keep battling."

Florida shot just 32.1 percent (17-53) in the game, including a 4-of-20 effort from the three-point arc, while Georgia sank 46.9 percent, including a 58.6 percent mark in the second half. The Lady Bulldogs also capitalized off of 23 Gator turnovers, converting them into 32 points.

Junior forward Tasha Humphrey led Georgia in both scoring and rebounding with 19 points and nine boards. Freshman guard Ashley Houts added 16 points and four assists for the Bulldogs, while junior forward Megan Darrah led all players with six assists.

"Florida played with a lot of heart and grit throughout the game," Georgia head coach Andy Landers said. "Their defensive strategy was solid, and frustrated us in the first half. We defended well, too. We didn't get frustrated to the point where we didn't defend well. They have some mismatches in terms of speed and quickness, but our defense stayed strong."

The Gators jumped out to an early 6-0 lead by way of a 3-point field goal from Dye and a 3-point play by Bowden. After an 11-4 Georgia run resulted in a one-point UF deficit with 12 minutes left in the opening frame, Dotson connected on a free throw to tie the score, and Bowden drilled a shot from well beyond the arc to give Florida a 14-11 lead at the second media timeout. Bowden was just one rebound shy of her double-double in the first half, scoring 10 points and grabbing nine boards in the opening frame for Florida, who headed to the locker room trailing by nine points, 36-27, after Georgia closed out the half on a 25-13 run.

Depree Bowden and Marsha Dotson both posted double-doubles as the Florida women's basketball team battled hard against Ole Miss, but fell short, 72-64, on Thursday night at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

Florida (6-17, 0-8) trailed 32-30 at halftime and kept the game close for the first five minutes of the second period, down just three, 42-39, with 15:34 remaining. Ole Miss then went on a 13-2 run over the next five and half minutes, pulling down seven of its 22 offensive rebounds during that stretch, as the Rebels (17-6, 6-2) seemed to be pulling away.

Like they've done all season, the Gators battled back, countering with a 10-0 run when Bowden tallied five points and cutting the deficit to four points, 55-51, with 5:47 on the clock.

After the teams traded layups, Ole Miss used a 9-3 spree and built its lead back to 10 points, 66-56, with 2:08 remaining in the game. Florida refused to fold, as Bowden canned a 3-pointer to start an 8-2 push, getting the Gators within four, 68-64, with 34 seconds left. But the Rebels sealed the game at the free throw line, hitting 4-of-6 the rest of the way.

"This team prepared themselves very well with knowing what they had to defend," Florida head coach Carolyn Peck said. "But we didn't do a good job taking care of the ball and then allowing Ole Miss 27 second-chance points. When you lose by eight - that hurts."

"For a team that is as young as we are and as small as we are, our players have hearts that are huge," continued Peck, as those Gators dropped their 10th straight game. "I'll take trying too hard rather than quitting or giving up. That's two things that the players on my team have not done."

"The thing I love about all my players is there is nothing that is stopping them from continuing to work hard and go after it," Peck added. "They are showing more courage right now than I have seen in a long time. They continue to fight and compete and they can walk around with these heads high because they know they are continuing to put forth a great effort."

Bowden led all scorers with 24 points while pulling in 12 rebounds and notching a career-high six assists. Dotson added 14 points and hit the boards for a career and game-high 18 rebounds. For Bowden, it was her third consecutive double-double and sixth overall, and for Dotson it was her third this season and fifth of her career.

Sha Brooks (Jackson, Tenn.) contributed nine points and four assists for the Gators in the hard fought game. She made a three-pointer for the 18th consecutive game, but struggled with her shot, hitting just 2-of-16.

Neither team shot well, as the teams combined to pull in 98 rebounds, with Ole Miss holding the slight 50-48 advantage. Florida also committed 26 turnovers which Ole Miss converted into 23 points.

The Gators shot 44.4 percent in the first half, but were limited to 27.8 percent in the second half and ended the game hitting 34.9 percent (22-63). The Rebels made just 34.1 percent in the first half, but shot 43.2 percent in the second half to finish with a 38.5 percent (30-78) mark.

Florida was 13-for-15 from the free throw line while Ole Miss made just 10-of-21 attempts from the charity stripe, but came through down the stretch.

Ole Miss had four players finish in double figures, led by Arminite Price's 17 points, who also had 10 rebounds to also finish with her 52nd career double-double. Ashley Awkward netted 16 points, Alliesha Easley put up 12 points and Shawn Goff contributed 10 points to help the Rebels snap a two-game losing streak.

Game 24: Kentucky 84, Florida 74

February 4, 2007 * Lexington, Ky. * Memorial Coliseum

Senior Briana Phillips scored 20 of her career-high 23 points during Florida's furious second-half rally, but the Gators couldn't overcome early shooting woes and a significant deficit, losing to Kentucky, 84-74, Sunday afternoon at Memorial Coliseum.

Florida, which nearly staged the largest comeback win in program history, found itself in a 28-point hole with 15 minutes remaining before getting within five points, 77-72, with 1:06 remaining, but couldn't pull out the victory, as Kentucky didn't hit a field goal in the last 3:55, but hit 12-of-17 free throws in the final three minutes to seal the win.

"One thing that has remained consistent with the players on our team is that they just don't quit," UF head coach Carolyn Peck said. "I wish we would have had the depth to start the game the way we finished it because our pressing made a huge difference and we forced a bunch of turnovers off our press. If one layup falls or a 3-pointer goes down, we might have put just enough pressure on Kentucky and the game might have swayed one way or the other."

The Gators overcame UK's 22-6 start and got within six points with four minutes remaining in the first half, but the Wildcats ended the period on a 13-0 run to take a 43-24 halftime lead.

Florida's deficit swelled to 28 points, 55-27, with 15 minutes remaining in the game, but the gritty Gators chipped away and never gave up, as Florida kept plugging away and got within 15 points, 59-44, with nine minutes left. Amani Franklin hit a huge 3-pointer for UK, which sparked an 8-2 run as the Wildcats tried to pull away, taking a 67-47 lead. But the Gators rallied with a 14-4 spree - eight points from Depree Bowden and got within 10 points, 71-61, with 3:07 left.

Florida began fouling Kentucky on every possession thereafter, but the Wildcats remained cool at the line, canning 12-of-17 during that stretch and 21-of-30 during the game to take snap a two-game losing streak, while handing the Gators (6-18, 0-9 SEC) their 11th straight loss.

Phillips contributed a career-high 23 points, hitting 4-of-6 3-pointers, which were her first of the season, and 5-of-5 from the free throw line. Marshae Dotson (Columbus, Ohio) contributed 17 points with six rebounds despite playing most of the game in foul trouble, while Bowden tallied 10 of her 14 points in the second half, when the Gators out-scored the Wildcats, 50-41.

Florida committed just 11 turnovers while forcing 22 Kentucky miscues, but shot just 37.3 percent (28-75) in the game, including a 31.4 percent clip in the first half. The taller Wildcat club hit 51.9 percent (28-54), including 58.6 percent in the opening frame, also ending with a 44-31 rebounding advantage.

Kentucky ripped out of the gates on a 22-6 run, as the Gators struggled with their shot to open the game. Marshae Dotson accounted for all of UF's early points, but picked up her second personal foul during the spree and was forced to the sideline to watch the Wildcats score their final six points during the run and build the 16-point lead with less than 12 minutes remaining in the half.

Sha Brooks' 17-foot jumper stopped UK's run and started a 6-0 Gator swing, as Sharielle Smith nailed a pair of outside shots to cut the deficit to 10 points, 22-12, with 10:38 left.

The teams exchanged buckets twice, but Florida's two were 3-pointers from Kim Dye and Phillips, as the Gators got within eight, 26-18, with 7:40 on the clock.

The Wildcats countered with four quick points, before Depree Bowden and Jennifer Mossor contributed toward a 6-0 run and reduced UK's lead to six, 30-24, with 3:55 remaining. Those points, however, would be the last for the Gators in the half, as the Wildcats ended the period on a 13-0 run and took a commanding 43-24 halftime lead.

Junior Depree Bowden scored a game-high 20 points, leading four Gators in double-figures, but Florida came up short, losing to No. 7 LSU, 79-66, at the Maravich Center in front of 5,386.

Bowden recorded her fourth career 20-point game and collected nine rebounds, while Marshae Dotson posted her fourth double-double of the year and sixth of her career netting 16 points with 10 rebounds and leading UF's rebounding effort that tied the taller Tigers, 34-all. Sha Brooks found her shooting touch in the second half, as she finished the night with 14 points and Briana Phillips tallied 13 points for her to notch a double-figure scoring effort for the second consecutive game and for the fourth time in her career, coming off the bench to hit three treys.

While UF did a good job of getting a more balanced scoring effort, turnovers ultimately determined the outcome, as the Gators (6-19, 0-10 SEC) committed 11 of their 20 in the second half.

"We did a good job of following our scouting report, but what was disappointing was the number of turnovers," UF head coach Carolyn Peck said. "When you give up 23 points off turnovers and you look at the second half and it was a five-point game, it's tough. Erica White got her hands on a lot of balls, but I think some of our turnovers could have been avoided."

LSU, which extended its nation-leading home win streak to 43, shot 50 percent (30-60) in the game while committing just 11 miscues. Quianna Chaney led the Tigers with 14 points, while RaShonta LeBlanc and Sylvia Fowles both added 11 points.

Dotson's first field goal of the second half got the Gators within seven points, 41-34, with 18 minutes remaining in the game before LSU ripped off a 10-0 run, forcing four UF turnovers during the span, as the Tigers took a 51-34 lead with just under 12 minutes left. Bowden stopped the run with a short jumper and scored all points during UF's ensuing 7-2 march, cutting the deficit to 12 points, 53-41, with just under 10 minutes on the clock, ending with a deep 3-pointer from the right side of the arc. The teams traded scores for the next few minutes before Bowden and Dotson connected on consecutive trips to get within nine points, 57-48, with 7:18 remaining in the game. LSU's Erica White then tallied the next three points before Bowden drilled another deep 3-pointer with defenders in her face and the Gators were again within nine, 60-51.

That's when LSU used a 7-0 on with all points from Quianna Chaney, as the Tigers built their lead back to 16 with just under four minutes left. While the Gators tried, they just couldn't counter, as the Tigers answered every Gator score with one of their own.

Florida shot 38.2 percent for the game, including a 41.7 percent effort from the 3-point arc where the Gators hit 10-of-24.

LSU scored the first two buckets of the game, but the Gators responded behind two straight inside baskets from Dotson and a 3-pointer from Phillips, as the Gators took a 7-4 lead just three minutes into the contest. The Tigers countered with an 11-3 run to take a 15-10 advantage thanks to seven points from LeBlanc. Florida answered with Bowden and Phillips netting the next two shots from the floor to cut the deficit to one, 15-14, with 11:13 remaining in the first half.

The teams exchanged scores over the next four minutes, with UF within two, before LSU used a quick 7-0 run to pull out to a 26-17 advantage with just under five minutes left. Dotson scored the next four points of the game and led a 6-2 Gator swing that cut LSU's lead to four points, 28-22, with 3:38 on the clock. LeBlanc canned a 3-pointer to start a 9-3 LSU run as the Tigers began to pull away, 37-25, with 41 seconds remaining. Florida, however, refused to fold as Sha Brooks hit a pair of free throws and Bowden sank a driving layup to get the Gators within eight, 37-28, entering the locker room.

Sha Brooks led a frantic comeback effort with 19 points, but it wasn't enough to overcome 10 three-point baskets and late solid free throw shooting from Mississippi State as the Lady Bulldogs escaped with a 79-74 victory over Florida on Sunday at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

Florida mounted a 19-9 run in the latter stages of the second half and turned what was a 16-point deficit into a tie game with less than two minutes to play but Mississippi State came up with a pair of layups and made its free throws down the stretch to seal the game.

The Bulldogs (16-9 overall, 6-4 SEC) were victorious for the sixth time in their last seven games, while the Gators fell to 6-20 on the season and 0-11 in SEC play. The loss was the 13th in a row for the Gators and matched the 2002-03 team's streak for the longest in school history.

Smith complimented Brooks with a career best 14 points, including 10 in the first half, while Phillips added 13 points and a career-best 13 rebounds. Brooks had her 19th double-figure scoring game this year and with three treys, she tied for fifth in UF history with 109 in her career.

Marneshia Richard led the Bulldogs with a game-high 24 points.

Florida tied the game at 69-69 for the first time since the early stages of the opening half after Marsha Dotson made a pair of free throws with 1:59 left. After a jumper from Mississippi State, Brooks drove to the basket and was fouled before making her free throws to tie the game at 71-71 with 59.6 remaining.

Alex Rack scored on a layup to make it 73-71 before Brooks missed a three. Robin Porter then connected on an uncontested layup to put Mississippi State up by four at 75-71 with 36.3 seconds left. After a missed three-pointer by Depree Bowden, Richard made a pair of free throws to put the Bulldogs in front 77-71 with 26 seconds left.

Brooks promptly canned a 3-pointer with 15.2 seconds to play and then produced a steal to give Florida the ball back down by three at 77-74 with 11 seconds left. Brooks missed a trey before Bowden grabbed the offensive rebound. She took an off-balance trey from the right side that didn't fall before the Bulldogs grabbed the rebound and UF fouled with 0.2 seconds.

Florida carried over its momentum from the end of the first half into the second by scoring nine of the first 11 points. Phillips got things going with a bucket to bring UF within six at 38-32. After the Bulldogs answered, Brooks canned a three-pointer before adding a pair free throws at the 17:14 mark. Following a Mississippi State timeout, Smith scored on a fast-break layup to bring the Gators within one at 40-39 with 16:31 left to play.

Florida again came as close as a point when Kim Dye made a three-pointer with 14:45 left to make the score 43-42 in favor of the Bulldogs. Mississippi State responded with a pair of threes and a three-point play to move back in front by double figures at 52-42 with 12:15 to go.

The Gators still had fight left in them when Smith secured an offensive rebound and a put-back to set her career high with her 14th point before Dotson scored on a put-back three possessions later to bring Florida back within six at 52-46 with 10:27 remaining in the game. MSU answered with a 7-0 run to move back in front by 11 at 59-48 with 7:03 to play. Phillips connected on a three-pointer to cut the lead to eight at 59-51 before Dotson added a basket and Dye notched her second three of the game to bring the Gators within five at 61-56 with 5:40 left. After a pair of free throws from the Bulldogs, Brooks closed the gap to four after a three-point play before Phillips capped a 13-4 run with a 10-foot baseline jumper to narrow the gap to two at 63-61 with 5:01 remaining. MSU scored the next four points before the Gators made four-straight free throws to again come within two at 67-65 with 3:15 to go. After the Bulldogs went ahead 69-65, Phillips added a basket before Dotson made a pair of free throws to tie the game at 69-69 with 1:59 left. After Brooks again tied the contest at 71-71 with 59.6 seconds left, the Bulldogs out-scored the Gators 8-3 the rest of the way to close out the game.

Game 27: Florida 66, Alabama 64 February 18, 2007 * Tuscaloosa, Ala. * Coleman Coliseum

Sophomore Marsha Dotson scored a team-high 24 points leading Florida to an exciting 66-64 victory over Alabama Sunday afternoon at Coleman Coliseum. The win snapped the Gators' 66-game losing streak, while handing the Crimson Tide their consecutive 12th loss.

It was a one-possession game for the final 6:42 of the contest, with four lead changes and one tie, as neither team was able to pull away. With the score knotted at 64-all, Dotson sealed off her defender at the top of the key and Jennifer Mossor dropped in a perfect pass as Dotson powered in an uncontested layup with 54 seconds remaining to give the Gators a two-point lead.

Depree Bowden stripped the ball from Navonda Moore on Alabama's next possession and Sha Brooks dribbled the ball trying to run the clock out. But Talisha Chandler picked Brooks' pocket with 10 seconds remaining, giving the Tide one final chance. Moore put up a shot from under the basket, which rolled around the rim and fell out as the final horn sounded.

Florida started quickly in the first half, but Alabama took charge to open the second, using a 23-7 run to erase the Gators' 33-26 halftime lead and take a 49-40 advantage with just under 13 minutes remaining in the game.

Shortly afterwards, Dotson scored five straight points and got Florida within four points, 51-47, with 10:09 left. The teams traded buckets, with Alabama's Navonda Moore sinking a trey that lifted the Tide to a 56-49 edge with 9:05 on the clock.

Again the teams exchanged scores, as Alabama maintained a six-point lead, 58-52, with 7:48 remaining. Jennifer Mossor hit one free throw, missing the second, but Dotson collected the miss and powered the ball back in to spark a 9-2 Gator run that gave Florida a 61-60 lead with 3:30 on the clock. Tamara Williams hit a jumper that swung the lead back to Alabama, but Brooks answered with an 8-footer from the right side and Dotson followed with a pair of free throws that gave the Gators a 64-62 lead with 1:33 remaining. Moore tied the game with two free throws with 1:24 on the clock, setting the stage for Dotson's final bucket.

Brooks joined Dotson as the only Gators in double-figures contributing 14 points with four steals. Dotson, who also collected nine rebounds, hit 9-of-10 from the floor.

Moore led Alabama with 24 points, while Talisha Chandler recorded 12 points and 14 rebounds, helping the Tide out-rebound the Gators 47-34, including 25 offensive boards.

Florida roared out from the opening tip, hitting four of its first five shots, including three-pointers from Sha Brooks and Kim Dye, and short jumpers from Depree Bowden and Marsha Dotson, as the Gators built a 10-2 lead, while the Tide hit just 1-of-7 shots during those opening two minutes.

Alabama finally settled and put back a pair of offensive rebounds to cut UF's lead to four points, 10-6. The Gators responded with a 6-0 run and upped their lead to 10 points, 16-6, with 12:31 remaining in the first half.

The teams traded buckets for the next few minutes until Alabama went on a 7-0 march and got within three, 25-22, with 4:35 left. Dotson stopped the run with a 12-footer and Brooks hit a deep trey and the advantage was back to eight. The Tide tried another run, scoring the next four points, but Brooks dropped in her third 3-pointer of the period to end the half's scoring with the Gators taking a 33-26 lead into the locker room.

Brooks led all first-half scorers with 11 points, hitting 3-of-6 from the 3-point arc, while Dotson tallied eight points and seven rebounds. Both teams shot identical from the field, hitting 10-of-33, but UF hit five treys compared to one for the Tide. UF also converted all eight of its free throw attempts, while UA sank 5-of-8 from the charity stripe, but did hold a 25-18 rebounding edge.

Game 28: Auburn 78, Florida 62

February 22, 2007 * Auburn, Ala. * Beard-Eaves Memorial Coliseum

Sha Brooks scored a game-high 17 points but it wasn't enough to lead Florida to victory, as the Gators lost to Auburn, 78-62, at Beard-Eaves Memorial Coliseum on Thursday evening.

Junior Depree Bowden (Palmetto, Fla.) also contributed double figures, netting 14 points for Florida (7-21, 1-12 SEC), which was out-scored by just two points in the second half but couldn't overcome a 14-point halftime deficit.

After Florida cut that hole in half, Auburn used a game-breaking 15-0 run midway through the second period and the Gators never recovered.

"Auburn's second chance opportunities really made a difference during that run," Florida head coach Carolyn Peck said. "Marsha (Dotson) was in foul trouble and Auburn took advantage of that by going inside and hitting their shots."

The Tigers (18-11, 5-8 SEC) used two healthy runs to distance themselves in the first half, taking a 38-24 lead after the first 20 minutes of play, when Florida shot just 30.3 percent (10-33).

Auburn's significant height advantage and Florida's frontcourt foul trouble, forced the Gators to shoot the ball from the outside, where they hit just 3-of-22 three-pointers during the game, while shooting 37.3 percent overall.

Jordan Greenleaf scored 16 points to lead a balanced Tiger scoring attack that featured four players in double-figures, including a 15-point, 11-rebound effort from DeWanna Bonner.

The teams traded baskets for the first five minutes of the second half and Florida was unable to make up any ground on its 14-point halftime deficit until Sha Brooks hit an 8-foot jumper to spark a 9-0 spree that brought the Gators within seven points, 48-41, with 12:21 remaining. Briana Phillips capped the march with a three-point play, putting back an offensive rebound and making the free throw after being fouled.

Auburn, however, responded with a devastating 15-0 run over the next three minutes, as the Tigers' lead ballooned to 22 points with just under nine minutes left in the game.

Florida tried to get back into the game, using a 8-0 run with a trey from Brooks, a three-point play from Jennifer Mossor and a 6-foot jumper from Kim Critton, which cut the deficit to 14 points, 70-56, with 3:26 remaining, but the hole was too much to overcome for the Gators, who had their two-game win streak in the state of Alabama snapped.

Auburn opened the game with a quick bucket in the paint before Sha Brooks answered for Florida with a deep 3-pointer to give the Gators a 3-2 advantage. The teams traded equal baskets for the next four minutes which featured six lead changes.

With UF holding a 9-8 lead after Depree Bowden's nifty pass-fake layin with just over 15 minutes left in the half, Auburn's Joanna Clayden scored eight points during an 11-0 run, as the Tigers raced out to a 19-9 advantage. Marsha Dotson stopped the spree with a scoop shot under the basket, but Auburn scored the next few points and upped its lead to 12 at the 11:34 mark.

The Gators refused to fold and mounted a 7-1 run and cut the deficit to six points, 24-18, with 8:45 on the clock. The teams then traded buckets for the next few minutes before the Tigers closed the half on a 12-4 spree and took a 38-24 halftime lead. More importantly for the Gators, during Auburn's half-ending stretch, Dotson and Phillips each collected their third personal foul, as Florida's frontcourt took a blow.

Bowden scored eight points with five rebounds in the first half to lead Florida, which shot just 30.3 percent (10-33) and was out-rebounded, 25-18. The taller Tigers, who took advantage of UF's foul troubles, hit 46.7 percent (14-30) from the floor to build their 14-point halftime edge.

February 25, 2007 * Gainesville, Fla. * O'Connell Center

Sha Brooks recorded 28 points on 8-for-13 shooting to match her career high, and three additional Gators scored in double-figures to lead the Gators to an 83-79 victory over Kentucky on Sunday in the O'Connell Center, during a close contest that featured 20 lead changes and 10 ties.

The game, which was the final regular-season contest for both teams, marked Florida's second consecutive year of winning its final home and regular-season contests. Last year, the Gators upset No. 2 LSU in their home finale before knocking off No. 5 Tennessee in Knoxville to end the regular season.

Sophomore Marsha Dotson narrowly missed a double-double with 22 points and nine rebounds, while junior Depree Bowden chipped in 16 points and senior Briana Phillips added 12, as Florida (8-21, 2-12 SEC) shot a season-high 50 percent from the field on 28-of-56 shooting.

"I compliment this team. We talked about making today very special for our seniors, and the focus, concentration and determination that this team played with made it tough for anyone to take this game away from us," Florida head coach Carolyn Peck said. "It's been a challenging season, but myself and the team has really appreciated all of the fans who have stuck with us through thick and thin. What meant the most to me today, though, was that our seniors could walk off of this court and say that they won their final home game."

Florida came out strong in the second period and overcame a 39-36 halftime deficit on back-to-back baskets by Bowden and Dotson for a 40-39 lead. UK briefly jumped back in command with a jumper by Sarah Elliott, but Dotson gave Florida a 44-41 lead with two-straight baskets. Bowden increased Florida's lead to 46-41 with a pair from the line before Kentucky (17-12, 6-8 SEC) came back with a trey and a two-point basket to knot the score at 46-41.

Phillips and Dotson combined for three-straight Florida baskets to give the Gators a 52-46 lead with 15 minutes to play, and increased its lead to 54-47 on free throws by Bowden. Kentucky came back and tied the score at 60-60 on a 13-6 run, and took its first lead since the opening minute of the half on a three by Amani Franklin. Florida and Kentucky traded shots for the next several minutes until the Gators reclaimed the lead at the 6:34 mark with a bucket from Phillips. The Wildcats followed a free throw with a layup for a 70-68 lead, but Brooks notched back-to-back layups for a 72-70 Florida lead with just under three minutes to play.

Bowden's shot from the line increased Florida's lead to 73-70, and Brooks added four more on a layup that was followed by a steal and another layup on a fastbreak. Kentucky's Jennifer Humphrey put the Wildcats back within two with under a minute to play, but Brooks put Florida ahead by six, 78-72, on a pair from the line. Jenny Pfeiffer hit a three for Kentucky with 45 seconds remaining to trail 78-75, and Brooks went to the line on four-straight possessions where she was 5-of-8. With the score at 81-79 and 13 seconds on the clock, Dotson nailed a pair from the line to give Florida an 83-79 victory.

"Sha has played through a lot of pain this season, but you wouldn't know it because of the heart she plays with. (Senior) Kim Dye had some pain, too, from her back to her ankle, but these players have never used injuries as an excuse. Her determination and fight - you can't even put into words how hard they've been playing and how much they've been sacrificing," Peck added.

Kentucky shot a steady 49.4 percent from the floor during the game, but committed 11 of its 16 turnovers in the deciding second period. The Gators capitalized on those miscues, turning them into 18 points, while holding a 40-34 advantage in points-in-the-paint against the taller Wildcats, who did carry a 43-33 rebounding advantage.

Marshae Dotson scored 25 points with 11 rebounds leading Florida to a 69-63 victory over Mississippi State Thursday evening in the first round of the SEC Tournament.

The Gators (9-21), who have won three of their last four games since a 13-game losing streak, became only the fifth No. 11 seed to defeat the No. 6 seed in the 28-year history of the tournament and the first since Arkansas downed Mississippi State in 2005.

Sophomore Sha Brooks (Jackson, Tenn.) added 16 points, doing most of her offensive damage from the free throw line where she hit 9-of-9, while freshman Sharielle Smith (Bradenton, Fla.) collected a career-high 11 rebounds, helping Florida enjoy a 48-37 rebounding advantage and overcome a poor shooting night when the Gators hit just 31.3 percent (20-64) from the floor, but more than made up for it from the free throw line by canning 27-of-31.

MSU (17-13) used a 9-2 run during the first 7:18 of the second half, building on its one-point halftime lead to take a 39-31 advantage. UF missed its first nine shots of the period before Dotson broke through with a jumper in the paint at the 12:26 mark. The teams traded buckets before Dotson hit one free throw and a physical shot in the lane to cut the deficit to five and ignite an 11-2 run capped by a three-point play from Brooks, as the Gators took a 44-43 lead with 8:21 on the clock.

Again the teams exchanged scores for the next two minutes before Briana Phillips (Palmetto, Fla.) and Brooks tallied four straight and lifted Florida to a 50-47 advantage with just under six minutes remaining and the Gators wouldn't trail again, turning those four points into a 12-2 spree that resulted in a 58-49 lead with 1:24 remaining. The Bulldogs kept it interesting by hitting three 3-pointers and a regular field goal in the final 1:24 and forcing Florida to seal the game at the line, where the SEC's second-best free throw shooting team remained calm in the clutch and hit 13-of-15 to earn the hard-fought win.

Marneshia Richard scored a team-high 18 points for the Bulldogs, who shot just 35.8 percent during the game and committed 16 turnovers.

Mississippi State was hot from long range to open the game, riding a pair of 3-pointers to a 10-4 lead in the first three minutes. Florida continued to drive and attack the basket, collecting multiple offensive rebounds that helped spark an 8-0 run over the next four minutes, as the Gators took a 12-10 lead. Dotson scored four points in the paint during the stretch, while Smith and Depree Bowden hitting short jumpers.

After the teams traded buckets, the Bulldogs scored five straight points, but Dotson settled the Gators with an offensive rebound put-back and Smith sank a layin after a great dish from Jennifer Mossor to get Florida back on top, 18-17, with just over nine minutes left in the half.

MSU hit its fourth trey of the period to top the run, but Dotson again answered with a tough shot over defenders and Sha Brooks canned UF's first 3-pointer to give the Gators a 23-20 advantage. The teams exchanged shots for the next minute before the Bulldogs broke the trend and took a 26-25 lead with four minutes remaining. Both teams went cold from the floor, but Florida did get buckets from Brooks and Brittaney Thomas and assumed a 29-26 lead with a little over two minutes left. MSU scored the final two buckets of the period, including one from Tysheka Grimes with two seconds remaining that gave the Bulldogs a 30-29 halftime lead.

Neither team shot well in the opening half, as Florida hit 30 percent (12-40) and MSU just 33.3 percent (10-33). The Gators held a 28-19 rebounding advantage, which included nine offensive rebounds. Smith collected nine of the rebounds, which tied her career high for a game, while Dotson scored 10 points with seven boards, four on the offensive end. The opening 20 minutes featured eight lead changes and four tied scores.

Game 31: #12 Vanderbilt 105, Florida 77

March 4, 2007 * Duluth, Ga. * The Arena at Gwinnett Center * SEC Tournament Quarterfinals

One night after becoming just the fifth No. 11 seed to advance to the Southeastern Conference Tournament quarterfinals, Florida ran into a hot-shooting Vanderbilt team that hit 66 percent from the floor, including 11-for-15 from the three-point arc during the game and ended the Gators' season with a 105-77 decision Friday evening at The Arena at Gwinnett Center.

Third-seeded Vanderbilt (25-5) came out sizzling, hitting 13 of its first 19 shots from the floor, including 4-of-5 from behind the arc, en route to building a 33-16 lead with 7:49 remaining in the opening half. The Commodores didn't stop there, ending the period with a 70.4 percent clip, nailing 19-of-27 overall including 7-of-8 from long range and assumed a commanding 54-34 halftime lead and the Gators (9-22) just couldn't recover.

The loss marked Carolyn Peck's final game coaching the Gators, as she steps down with a 72-76 record after five seasons on the Florida sideline.

Sophomore Marshae Dotson (Columbus, Ohio) scored a game-high 20 points along with nine rebounds, while sophomore Sha Brooks (Jackson, Tenn.) recorded 17 points and senior Briana Phillips (Palmetto, Fla.) added 11 points and six rebounds for Florida, which shot 37.3 percent (25-67) from the floor. The Gators held their own in the paint against the taller Commodores, who held a slight 34-32 rebounding edge, with Florida collecting 19 of its boards on the offensive end.

Christina Wirth scored 19 points, hitting all five of her 3-point attempts to lead a balanced Vanderbilt attack that produced the second-highest shooting percentage all-time in a game by a Florida opponent. Caroline Williams scored most of her 16 points from beyond the arc, canning 4-of-5, as five different players helped the Commodores become the first team to top the 100-point plateau since Georgia scored 105 on Jan. 12, 2003.

Florida ended its 33rd season of varsity competition winning four of its last six games after losing 13 straight.

Dotson scored the first points of the game, but Vanderbilt answered with a 7-0 run. Senior Kim Dye (Fayetteville, Tenn.), who finished with nine points in her final collegiate game, canned a three-pointer and had Florida within two points, 7-5, with 17:39 remaining. The Commodores, however, countered with a 9-2 spree for a 17-7 lead. Brooks hit a 3-pointer, trying to keep the Gators close, but Vandy again countered by scoring the next four points.

After buckets from Phillips and Brooks, Florida chipped the deficit to seven points, 21-14, with just over 12 minutes left in the period. That's when the Commodores went on a 12-2 march and began to pull away, taking a 33-16 lead, with 8:37 on the clock before hitting four more treys to take a commanding 54-34 halftime advantage.

COACH PECK: "It's been a privilege and an honor to work with these young women, Briana and Kim Dye. These two young women have stayed committed and loyal and shown a great deal of determination, because you can tell a lot of character about people, not just when times are good, but when times are bad. And these two have shined in those times. Both of them have had injuries that have caused them to sit out for a whole entire season. And for them to get themselves in the position, be able to do the things that they have done, I'm extremely proud of them."

"Today was a war and a battle. There are things I can say and things I can't. But I think that, you know, Vanderbilt, they played hard. They've got a deep bench. You know, it was a tough battle. But the Gators, this team, they never quit, and they won't. These two young women up here, you know what, they're going to be successful in real life because they don't quit. And the returning players, they've got quite a core group now because we cleaned up a lot of good stuff, and there's a lot of good stuff that's gonna be there at Florida when I leave. And so a lot of you may measure wins and losses by the points at the end of the game, but I think my group had a lot of victories and a lot of wins because of the things that they're doing as people, and I'm proud of 'em."
